South Perth Station Precinct Planning Design Forum



The South Perth Station Precinct (SPSP) Planning Design Forum ran from 13 to 17 March 2017 with the City undertaking intensive community and stakeholder consultation.

Part of the Place + Design: South Perth Station Precinct study facilitated by urban design, planning and place making consultants RobertsDay, the Forum provided a unique opportunity for community members and land owners to work with key state government agencies, City staff and a team of urban planning and design, architecture, traffic and transport and economic consultants over a week of workshops and design investigations.

Participants discussed topics including the character of the area, movement and transport, public realm, built form and architecture, and governance, with input from expert consultants in each topic.

Public exhibitions were held to present the work in progress and provided an opportunity for further feedback to be collected.

A final report and recommendations from the Forum will be presented at a public open day on Saturday 20 May 2017.

Works in your neighbourhood

Road works and pavement rehabilitation

Works include some or all of the following: resurfacing with stone mastic asphalt, replacement of street kerbing on same alignment, replacement/installation of stormwater drainage structures and replacement signage and road markings.

- Bessell Avenue – Canning Highway to Throssell Street
- Labouchere Road – South Terrace to Hensman Street

Stormwater Drainage

Works include upgrade of existing stormwater drainage networks to increase storage capacity and mitigate localised flooding within various urban catchments.

- Catchment 36: Elizabeth Street – Addison Street to Milson Street
- Catchment 32: Albert Street – Rose Avenue to Coode Street

- Catchment 33: Strickland Street – Infill between South Terrace and Hensman Street
- Queen Street Pump Station – Replace pumps and control cabinet
- Frasers Lane Pump Station – Replace control cabinet
- Scott Street Pump Station – Replace secondary pump

- Banksia Terrace – two locations, conversion of two way /one lane treatments to two way
- Bessell Avenue – Canning Highway to Throssell Street – Slow points
- Thelma Street Closure – At Canning Highway
- Ley Street – Henley Street to Davilak Street median treatment

South Perth Station Precinct Weekly news updates relating to traffic and parking management in the area are posted on our South Perth Station Precinct page.

Current works ATCO Gas are upgrading the gas

main on Mends Street, Labouchere Road and Bowman Street.

Water Corporation will also be replacing existing underground water mains on selected streets to improve the security and reliability of the water supply to the area.

Traffic management will be in place and access to impacted properties will be available at all times, although there may be some minor delays. Work is scheduled for completion in July 2017.

Ernest Johnson Reserve redevelopment

The City of South Perth commenced construction works for the \$10.5 million Ernest Johnson (EJ) Reserve redevelopment in February 2017.

EJ Reserve is one of the most well-known and popular playing fields in the City. The Reserve's six associated buildings are being redeveloped to better accommodate the needs of relevant sporting clubs, community groups, the local community and the City.

Works will be completed in two stages, with the first stage including construction of new clubrooms, parking facilities and associated infrastructure. Works completed to date include; earthworks, installation of new sewer lines and storm water pits, detailed excavation and pouring of the concrete pad and footings. These works are on schedule for completion at the end of 2017.

The second stage of the project will include civil works such as demolition of existing buildings, oval works, and construction of sports facilities, playgrounds and social areas.

Stage 2 is expected to commence early in 2018 with completion scheduled for June 2018.

Westralian Centre concept

The City is seeking to develop the Westralian Centre, a proposed multi-purpose interpretive facility, public space and major tourist attraction to be located approximately 300m west of Coode St jetty within Sir James Mitchell Park on the South Perth foreshore.

At the City's February 2017 Council Meeting, the Council resolved to give in principle support to the proposed project and the City will now commence initial investigations and preparatory works.

Feedback on the proposal will be sought from a range of local, state and national stakeholders and in the coming months the City will commence community and stakeholder engagement.

Concept plans for the Westralian Centre have been developed within the context of the City's South Perth Foreshore Strategy and Management Plan (SPF Plan) which identifies key uses, objectives and strategies for 10 nodes along the iconic stretch of foreshore. The proposed

project will deliver on the vision for Node 9 identified through the SPF Plan stakeholder engagement and community consultation process.

As outlined in the SPF Plan, the strategy for Node 9 is to develop a landmark site, representing national, state, local and Aboriginal significance, that expresses the historical background of the area; and a landmark event space for calendar civic and social events that provides recreational facilities throughout the year.

It is intended that the Westralian Centre be a commemorative public space that celebrates unique Western Australian stories, culture and heritage while fitting sensitively into the landscape, respecting the surrounding natural environment and preserving vistas to the City and Swan River.

MENDS STREET CONNECT SOUTH



Mends Street Connect South is a \$7.5 million major project to enhance and invigorate the Mends Street precinct and foreshore area. The project has grown from the South Perth Foreshore Strategy and Management Plan which identified Node 1 Mends Street as a key priority area for improvement.

In October 2016, the City successfully secured \$2.5 million in Round 3 of the National Stronger Regions Fund (NSRF) to join the City's contribution of \$5 million over two financial years.

Mends Street Connect South is about creating a dynamic destination at this important riverside location. A lively place where tourists, families, workers and residents gather in the day and linger into the evening. A transport and commercial hub, where local businesses thrive and the diverse and rich history of the area is celebrated.

The City has commenced a tender process and will soon appoint a consultant to provide urban design and landscape services for the first stage of the project.

The first stage of the project will focus on Mends Street between Mill Point Road and the foreshore and parts of the South Perth Esplanade. It will deliver a piazza on the foreshore as well as streetscape and amenity improvements, landscaping upgrades and place activation. Community and stakeholder engagement will continue as part of vision and the concept design process.

Future proposed project stages will include upgrades to the Mends Street Jetty, park areas either side of the piazza and Mends Street between Mill Point Road and Labouchere Road.

A celebration of arts, events and culture



In 2017 the City of South Perth's cultural calendar brought with it a host of experiences for the entire community to enjoy including pop-up outdoor activities, public art displays and the hugely popular Fiesta Concert and Angelo Street Marketplace.

Nine thousand people attended the Fiesta Concert, headlined by Australian singer-songwriter Emma Louise, with support from Thelma Plum. Held on Sir James Mitchell Park, the celebrations concluded with the stunning Pagoda Resort & Spa fireworks.

The community came together again at the Angelo Street Marketplace with one of the biggest street celebrations the City has seen. Drawing a record crowd of 15,000 people, patrons experienced a day of fashion, music, art, crafts and gourmet street food. The Artwalk presented by 96FM featured artworks including inflatable installations from international artist Filthy Luker. The ever-popular South Perth Senior Citizens Gopher Muster saw Laurie Nicholls win the coveted Gopher Muster trophy.

Confluence, by artist Sean van der Poel piqued people's curiosity, bringing 7,000 people to South Perth foreshore to view the interactive art installation.

Once again 'Find Me' activities delighted local residents and visitors alike as they stumbled across pop-up activations dotted throughout the City.

Goldilocks and the Three Bears turned Neil McDougall Park into an outdoor theatre, with 400 children, parents and grandparents singing and dancing along to the live performance.

At the end of March, the City celebrated National Youth Week by hosting a range of free practical hands-on workshops as well as live music and entertainment for 12 to 25 year olds.

‘First Hour Free’ parking trial for Mends Street Precinct



The City has introduced a ‘First Hour Free’ parking trial on South Perth Esplanade in the Mends Street precinct.

Commencing 1 May, patrons can now take advantage of free one hour parking

in the two South Perth Esplanade car parks (SPE- 3 and SPE – 4) situated to the east and west of Mends Street jetty. The trial will also include ‘First Hour Free’ on-street parking along the Esplanade from

opposite Harper Terrace through to Queen Street.

The free one hour parking is available between 8am and 6pm Monday to Sunday, with a two hour maximum applying between these hours for SPE3 and SPE4 car parks. On-street parking along South Perth Esplanade will have one hour free with ticket parking after the first hour between 8am and 6pm Monday to Sunday with no maximum limit.

“The local businesses and Mends Street Traders recently asked the City to increase the supply of short term free parking in the Mends Street Precinct and the Council has responded by endorsing this parking trial,” City of South Perth Deputy Mayor Glenn Cridland said.

Free one hour parking is also provided in the undercover South Shore Shopping Centre car park off South Perth Esplanade. For details visit southshoreshoppingcentre.com.au. ■

Lighting up Angelo Street

Fourteen feature ‘Gobo’ lights have been installed on existing light poles along Angelo Street between Strickland Street and Waverley Street. Instead of putting in hanging or up-lights for special events like Christmas, the City has found an innovative alternative that can be used throughout the year. The lights project images along the footpath at night between 7 and 10 pm adding character and interest. The lights can project different patterns with over 100 templates available. The City plans to install a Christmas theme for the festive season. ■



New playground for Richardson Reserve

Richardson Reserve near the Perth Zoo has a new playground, upgrading the old existing one that had been there for 20 years.

It has some interesting new play items; a cube and slide combination, musical instruments consisting of musical pipes, stainless drums and talk tubes. Sand play items include a sand wheel and a sand table.

The design is aimed to challenge children of different ages, with different physical skills.

In mid-2017 a picnic and barbeque area will be installed nearby to the playground, and new bench seats on paving will sit adjacent to the sandpit. ■



A plan for safer cycling

The City of South Perth and the Town of Victoria Park have been awarded funding for the development of a joint bike plan by the Western Australian Bicycle Network (WABN) Grants Program.

The joint bike plan will aim to understand the needs of the cycling community and seek to further develop the existing cycling infrastructure. It will also identify opportunities to improve the cycling network and provide better connections

across our two neighbouring local government areas.

A consultant has been appointed to undertake research into the current situation and identify best practice solutions that will make cycling safer and more convenient for our local community.

The community will be invited to contribute ideas, report issues and suggest improvements via a series of workshops and surveys. Visit yoursay.southperth.wa.gov.au to have your say and get involved.

The City is committed to meeting targets and overcoming challenges associated with an expected increase in population and flow on effects to our transport network.

The WABN is an initiative of the Western Australian State Government, administered by the Department of Transport. ■

Funding for underground power projects

Following an announcement by the State Government in January 2017, three nominated areas within the City of South Perth will have their overhead powerlines placed underground.

Round Six of the State Underground Power Program (SUPP) provides underground power to approximately 2,900 properties within the City.

The successful project areas that the City has secured funding for are;

Collier – all of the area bounded by Canning Highway, Ryrie Avenue, Blamey Place and South Terrace

Manning – all of the area bounded by Manning Road, Kwinana Freeway, Hope Avenue and Challenger Avenue

South Perth – all of the area bounded by Douglas Avenue, Canning Highway, Hovia Terrace and Mill Point Road.

(In some instances the defined project areas do not include the boundary streets.)

It is anticipated the City will commence the first of the projects in the 2018/19 financial year. Each project area is expected to take around 9 months to complete, with the City proposing to

undertake the works over 2018/19, 2019/20 and 2020/21.

“Placing overhead powerlines underground improves safety, service and streetscapes,” City of South Perth Mayor Sue Doherty said. “It reduces street tree pruning requirements, allowing trees to grow to natural height. Tree lined streets add significant value to properties and additionally, shady streetscapes encourage healthier lifestyles by promoting walking and cooling streets by up to 10 degrees.”

officially open when the message is read aloud and this will occur at the Opening Ceremony at the Gold Coast.

Local legends are being called on to carry the Queen's Baton in the City of South Perth as we prepare to host the Queen's Baton Relay. The nomination program offers the local community with an opportunity to carry the Baton. Batonbearers are people of all abilities who inspire others to be great.
