We're rolling out a new Verge Valet™ bulk waste collection service, Recycling Centre Reuse Shop and Containers for Change Bag Drop to support smarter, more sustainable waste management.



Verge Valet™ Collection

We've introduced a new pre-booked Verge Valet™ service to replace our previous fixed-date bulk waste collections.

Residents can book this service year-round for any items that can't be gifted, recycled, donated or fixed.

Book your collection at **vergevalet.com.au** or call 9384 6711.

Each residential property can book 1 free bulk waste and 2 free green waste collections per financial year. Put your waste out 1-3 days before your booked collection date and let Verge ValetTM do the rest.









Reuse Shop

Opening 20 Aug 2025

Donate or shop for pre-used items at our new Reuse Shop at the Recycling Centre.

8am-2pm | Wed-Sun

Please arrive no later than 1.45pm on Saturday and Sunday. Closed public holidays.



Containers for Change Bag Drop Opening 20 Aug 2025

Drop your eligible drink containers off at our new Containers for Change Bag Drop at the Recycling Centre.

8am-2pm | Wed-Sun

Please arrive no later than 1.45pm on Saturday and Sunday. Closed public holidays.



Extra Recycling Centre Entry Vouchers

This year, ratepayers will receive additional entries to the Recycling Centre with their 2025/26 Rates Notice, allowing them 2 hard waste and 4 green waste drop-offs.



NEVER PUT THESE ITEMS IN YOUR KERBSIDE BIN

These items can cause fires, injuries and equipment damage.

- ·Electrical items and batteries
- Gas bottles, pressurised vessels and aerosol cans
- ·Hazardous waste
- ·Car parts and tyres
- Any building material bricks, sand, concrete, tiles, rocks, asbestos
- ·Hot ashes or coals

HAZARDOUS WASTE

These dangerous materials need special handling – they must never go in your kerbside bin.
