NEIL MCDOUGALL PARK COMMUNITY GARDEN COORDINATION



Background

The City of South Perth area is the country of Beeloo Noongar people, or river people. Noongar people who used this area were known as Gareen and their place was Gareenup.

The City covers nearly 20 square kilometres and is situated across the Swan River from the Perth CBD. The City is bounded by the Swan and Canning Rivers and is widely recognised for its aesthetic appeal and amenity. There are several major local attractions and activities, including: Mindeerup; Sir James Mitchell Park; Perth Zoo; the Old Mill; Heritage House (displaying artworks from the City's May and Herbert Gibbs art collection and other items of historic connection); Ferry Tram; Collier Park Golf (including mini golf); Royal Perth Golf Club; Mends Street, Angelo Street and Preston Street precincts; and the Waterford Plaza Shopping Centre.

The City is also the home to various community facilities including community halls, libraries, recreation centre, play spaces and a community garden.

Community Gardens

Community gardens contribute to social and community development. The activities that take place in a community garden bring people of all ages and walks of life together and assists in building stronger communities. By getting involved with a community garden, or starting up your own, you can enjoy recreational gardening, information and knowledge sharing, cooperating through work parties, social events and growing food. The City aims to recognise the value of community gardens as a public amenity, as well as promote and encourage their positive outcomes including recreational activities, community development, education and events. Expression of Interest

The City is inviting expressions of interest (EOI) from suitable applicants to undertake the coordination of a community garden in Como. Applicants should be passionate about sustainable gardening and skill sharing, community capacity building, organic food production and/or promoting healthy living.

The community garden is a prospering organic fruit and vegetable farm that was established by a group of passionate volunteers in 2012 who believed in creating a safe, healthy and enjoyable community enterprise. The group has recently disbanded so an opportunity exists for a new group to undertake the community garden coordination into the future. The garden is fully reticulated and comprises a number of raised garden beds, wooden fencing planted with herbs, pizza oven, water tank and two ancillary buildings for storage and activities.

All EOIs submissions will need to address the qualitative criteria outlined in this document.

Support from the City

- ✓ Governance advice
- ✓ Volunteer management advice
- ✓ Funding advice (including funding opportunities via the City's Community Funding Program)

Some or all of the above support activities may be undertaken to establish a new McDougall Farm Community Garden Coordination Group if required. The successful applicant will be required to enter into a land use agreement with the City prior to commencing operations in the garden. This agreement will provide a framework for the management of the community garden. A full handover of the garden will be provided to the successful applicant.

Selection Criteria

Qualitative Criteria

It is essential that respondents address each qualitative criterion. The EOI submissions will be used as the basis for assessing proposals. Failure to provide the specified information may result in elimination from the EOI assessment process.

Description of Criteria	Weighting
Relevant Skills of the Respondent Does the EOI demonstrate that the respondent has the necessary gardening, community engagement and coordination skills to oversee a community garden on an ongoing basis?	40%
Demonstration of Capacity Does the EOI demonstrate that the respondent has the ability to be self-reliant, sufficiently resourced and prepared to fund and manage the governance, finances, insurances and operations of a community garden?	40%
Project Vision Does the EOI demonstrate that the applicant has an achievable vision for the community garden including where and how produce from the garden will be distributed; and that the vision aligns with relevant strategies in the City's Strategic Community Plan and requirements in Policy P113 'Community Gardens'?	20%

What to submit

As part of your Expression of interest you will need to submit the following:

- Completed EOI Application Form addressing the selection criteria.
- Any relevant documentation, images/pictures, or attachments to support your proposal.
- References to support your application (including business, contact person and details and the project details etc.).
- A copy of your certificate of incorporation (if incorporated).
- A copy of your certificate of currency (if you have public liability insurance).
