AUSTRALIA DAY MORNING CEREMONY

8-9.30am, Wednesday 26 January Sir James Mitchell Park, South Perth (opposite Forrest St) FREE

The City of South Perth invites all residents to attend the special Australia Day flag raising and Citizenship Ceremony at Sir James Mitchell Park. The program includes:

- Blessing of the flag and flag raising ceremony
- Citizenship Ceremony
- Traditional Welcome to Country
- Presentation of the AUSPIRE Community Citizen of the Year Award
- Presentation of the Ted Maslen Award for the student (resident of the City of South Perth) who achieves the highest score of all year 12 students within the City of South Perth.



GREAT AUSSIE BREAKFAST

9.30-10.30am, Wednesday 26 January Sir James Mitchell Park, South Perth (opposite Forrest St)

The Great Aussie Breakfast is set to sizzle after the Citizenship Ceremony with the Rotary Club of Como providing a BBQ breakfast with a choice of fruit and a cup of tea, coffee, juice or water for the small cost of \$5, which goes back into the local community. There will also be free kids entertainment.

Parking will be available on Coode St, off Mill Point Rd.



ENTERTAINMENT ZONES

3-8pm, Wednesday 26 January Four locations along Sir James Mitchell Park FREE

There will be four entertainment zones across the foreshore providing ideal viewing locations to watch the City of Perth Skyworks. There will be entertainment at each zone from 3-8pm including:

- Kids art activities
- Sport activities for all agesRoving entertainers
- Toddler zone

Free shuttle buses will run between George Burnett Leisure Centre, the City of South Perth Civic Centre and the four zones from 12pm until approximately 10pm.

IMPORTANT EVENT INFORMATION

BICYCLE PARKING

- Bicycle parking is available in the four entertainment zones
- Don't forget to bring a bike lock.

PENALTIES AND INFRINGEMENTS

- Double penalties apply to all City of South Perth infringements issued on Australia Day 2022. Please check signs before parking
- Illegally parked vehicles within the Access and Parking Restricted Areas will be towed and impounded. Please ensure your visitors are aware.

ITEMS NOT ALLOWED ON THE SOUTH PERTH FORESHORE

- For safety reasons please do not bring large objects (greater than 1.5m) as they will be impounded
- Please do not bring glass containers.

DRONES

• Drones are not permitted to fly over populous areas so please do not bring your drone to the Australia Day celebrations. For more information visit casa.gov.au/knowyourdrone/drone-rules.

IMPOUNDED GOODS

• Collection of impounded goods can be arranged from the following working day (27 January 2022) by phoning the City on 9474 0777.

ON-DEMAND TRANSPORT AND DELIVERY SERVICES

- On Australia Day, between the hours of 12pm and 10.30pm, on-demand transport services (such as taxis, Uber, Ola, Shebah and other vehicle charter companies) will not be permitted to drop off or pick up riders in the Access Restricted Area. Likewise, on-demand food delivery services (such as Domino's, Uber Eats, Deliveroo, Menulog and Eat Now) will not be allowed to deliver food inside the area
- To accommodate residents, Australia Day visitors and the on-demand services, the City will set up a temporary pick-up and drop-off area inside the City's Windsor Park Car Park, off Labouchere Rd.

FREE ACCESSIBLE EVENT TRANSPORT

To facilitate access to our four entertainment zones, the City will be providing a free shuttle service between;

- George Burnett Leisure Centre (GBLC), Manning Rd, Cnr Elderfield Rd, Karawara
- City of South Perth Civic Centre, Cnr Sandgate St and South Tce, South Perth
- Entertainment zones.

Both GBLC and the Civic Centre are easily accessible from the Kwinana Freeway and have ample parking with priority accessible parking for those with valid ACROD permits.

The shuttle buses will run approximately every 10 minutes back and forth between 12pm and approx 10pm with a break between 7.30 and 8.30pm to allow visitors to watch the fireworks.

All shuttle buses will be fully accessible for passengers with wheelchairs, prams or mobility devices.

Please note that information in this flyer is correct at the time of going to print. Due to the evolving COVID-19 situation, plans may change. The City will not post permits after Friday 14 January 2022 and they must be collected in person at the Civic Centre, cnr Sandgate St & South Tce, South Perth.

TRAFFIC AND PARKING Please read the following information carefully.

1. ACCESS RESTRICTED AREA (YELLOW ON MAP)



In this area, roads will be closed from **12pm to 10.30pm** on Australia Day, Wednesday 26 January 2022. No street, verge, or crossover* parking will be permitted during this time for residents or their visitors. Vehicles should only be parked on private property.

The Access Restricted Area is divided into four Residential Zones (see map: Zones A, B, C and D), with designated entry points for each zone (see map: entry A1, A2, B1, B2, C, D1 and D2).

The following information is only for those residing in the Access Restricted Area (yellow on map).

How do I enter the Access Restricted Area?

You should enter via the designated entry point for your Residential Zone. You do not need a special permit to enter but you will be asked to present a valid driver's license listing your current address. Utility bills or other documents linking your name to an address in the Access Restricted Area will not be accepted.

If your driver's license does not show your address as being in one of the four zones, you will need to apply for an Access Permit.

How do my visitors enter the Access Restricted Area?

If you expect visitors on Australia Day and you have parking space available on your property, you can apply for an Access Permit for your guests. Please note that there is to be no parking on any verge (including your crossover*) or in the street.

Your visitors can enter via the designated entry point for your address by presenting a valid Access Permit for that Residential Zone.

How does my care provider enter the Access Restricted Area?

Should you have a care provider scheduled to visit on Australia Day 2022, please contact the City during business hours on 9474 0777 to arrange for access within the Access Restricted Area.

The City will require name and contact details of the carer, the registration number for the carer's vehicle and your address inside the Access Restricted Area. Please note that there is to be no parking on any verge (including your crossover*) or in the street.

How do I apply for the Access Permit

You can apply for a permit online at southperth.wa.gov.au/australiaday

Alternatively, please complete the attached application form and forward it to the City:

- in person at the Civic Centre
- by email to enquiries@southperth.wa.gov.au
- by post to City of South Perth, Civic Centre, Cnr Sandgate St and South Tce, South Perth WA 6151

Your application must be received by 3pm on Tuesday 25 January 2022. Permits will not be posted after Friday 14 January 2022 and will need to be collected from the Civic Centre during business hours after this date.

Only people residing in the Access Restricted Area can apply for a permit.

2. PARKING RESTRICTED AREA (BLUE ON MAP)

Anyone can access this area, but parking is restricted to ensure sufficient access for emergency vehicles. Residents or guests who ordinarily park on the road or verge (this includes your crossover*), must observe the temporary parking signs. To find out if your street is affected, please refer to the map. Please ensure your visitors are aware of these restrictions.

*Your crossover is the area of driveway between the road and your property line. Please note that this is NOT considered to be your driveway and as such you are not permitted to use this area to park during Australia Day parking restricted times.

3. NO ACCESS AREA (DASHED RED LINE ON MAP)

Residents living in these areas will receive a separate letter detailing their access and parking options.

PARKING AND SHUTTLE BUS

The City will be providing a free shuttle service between;

- George Burnett Leisure Centre (GBLC), Manning Rd, Cnr Elderfield Rd, Karawara
- City of South Perth Civic Centre, Cnr Sandgate St & South Tce, South Perth
- Entertainment Zones, the shuttle buses will stop at each of the four entertainment zones along the foreshore.

All shuttle buses will be fully accessible for passengers with wheelchairs, prams or mobility devices.

The shuttle buses will run approximately every 10 minutes back and forth between 12pm and approx 10pm, with a break between 7.30 and 8.30pm to allow visitors to watch the fireworks.

Both GBLC and the Civic Centre are easily accessible from the Kwinana Freeway and have ample parking with priority accessible parking for those with valid ACROD permits. There will be accessible matting for people with disability, walkers, prams and strollers from the bus stop into each of the entertainment zones.
