- Located 4km south of the Perth CBD
- Established as a Roads Board in 1892
- Proclaimed in July 1959 as a City
- Proposed amalgamation with Town of Victoria Park rejected by community vote 2015
- Comprises suburbs of Como, Karawara, Kensington, Manning, Salter Point, South Perth and Waterford
- Major attractions: Mindeerup, South Perth Foreshore, Sir James Mitchell Park, Perth Zoo, Royal Perth Golf Club, Collier Park Golf Course and Mini Golf, the Old Mill, Ferry Tram





The Council


The City of South Perth is a Tier 2 local government and is divided into four wards each represented by two **Councillors** – eight in total:

Mill Point	x 2
Como	x 2
Moresby	x 2
Manning	x 2

The Council is presided over by a popularly elected **Mayor**.

All nine Elected Members hold four-year terms.

Council elections are held every two years on the third Saturday in October for half of the Councillors – 1 in each ward.
