Protecting Property Rights - Planting, pruning and removing trees

On July 28th 2025, the State Administrative Tribunal (SAT) in the case Zorzi and City of Cambridge (WASAT 77) delivered a decision that severely affects property owners concerning the pruning and removal of trees on private property. A public statement by Levan can be accessed called "Removing a Single Tree = Development". This decision has far-reaching consequences for property owners. Falling foul of development guidelines can create severe legal ramifications for owners wishing to extend their homes, sell their homes or landscape their gardens. I will fight for all property owners affected by these new decisions and ensure that some common-sense decisions are made by the City of South Perth going forward.

Sir James Mitchell Park

Market gardens were originally cultivated on the South Perth foreshore. The market gardens made way for the land to be used for sport and active recreation. The funding came from the State and Federal governments. The land has never been fully utilised because the lack of drainage means the park is waterlogged for about six months of the year.
