Policy Objectives

The City of South Perth has long been renowned for its green leafy streets, parks and residential areas. The objective of this policy is to ensure that tree cover in the City is maintained and enhanced where possible in light of increased densities on private land, a drying climate and ageing tree stock.

Policy Scope

This Policy is concerned with the management of trees on land under the care and control of the City.

Policy Statement

An urban forest is a forest or a collection of trees that grow within a city, town or a suburb. Urban forests play an important role in ecology of human habitats in many ways: they filter air, water, sunlight, provide shelter to animals and recreational area for people. They moderate local climate, slowing wind and stormwater, and shade homes and businesses conserving energy. They are critical in discounting the urban heat island effect, thus potentially reducing the number of unhealthy ozone days that plague major cities in peak summer months.

The City recognises and values the significance of an urban forest in terms of creating functional and aesthetic streetscapes, reserves and in the provision of natural habitat.

The City will plan for the provision, retention and maintenance of suitable trees in accordance with the strategies established in the Urban Forest Strategy Plan. The City recognises the need to remove unsuitable or unsafe trees on land under its care and control when required.

Tree planting will be in accordance with strategies identified in the Urban Forest Strategy Plan, Public Open Space Strategy and Green Plan.
