COVID-19 (Coronavirus disease)

New Information

- As of 27 March 2020, there are 255 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in WA.
- To date, 11,836 Western Australians who have tested for COVID-19 have returned a negative result.
- NEW & UPDATED DAILY <u>Daily Snapshot COVID-19</u>
- As at 18:00 AEDT 26 March 2020, there have been 2,799 laboratory confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Australia, and 13 deaths. Of the 2,799 confirmed cases, this includes 53 cases from the ACT, 1,219 cases from NSW, eight cases from the NT, 493 cases from QLD, 235 cases from SA, 40 cases from TAS and 520 cases from VIC.
- According to the most recent <u>WHO Situation Report</u> dated 10:00 CET <u>26</u> March 2020, in the past 24 hours:
 - Worldwide: 49,219 new confirmed cases (462,684 total); 2,401 new deaths (20,834 total);
 - Western Pacific Region: 1,292 new confirmed cases (99,058 total); 22 new deaths (3,540 total);
 - European Region: 29,771 new confirmed cases (250,287 total); 1,964 new deaths (13,950 total);
 - South-East Asia: 192 new confirmed cases (2,536 total); 7 new deaths (79 total);
 - Eastern Mediterranean Region: 2,811 new confirmed cases (32,442 total); 154 new deaths (2,162 total);
 - Regions of the Americas: 14,878 new confirmed cases (75,712 total); 252 new deaths (1,065 total);
 - o African Region: 275 new confirmed cases (1,937 total); two new deaths (31 total).
- From 00:00 AEDT 28 March 2020, all people returning to Australia will be required to self-isolate in a hotel or other accommodation for 14 days before returning home.
- On 27 March 2020, the Premier announced travel between regions in Western Australia will be restricted from midnight 31 March 2020. Regional boundaries will mirror those of the state's Regional Development Commissions. Further detail will be released later.
- TRAVEL On 24 March the Prime Minister announced a ban on all overseas travel, with few
 exceptions. If you have future travel planned or are considering going overseas, cancel or postpone
 these plans. A ban is in place. The risks to your health and that of others is too great. For urgent

- WA borders closed at 13:30 24 March 2020. Interstate arrivals are now required to self-isolate for 14 days, and the border controls apply to all road, air, rail and sea access points. Exceptions apply for essential services and workers. Please see details Self-Isolation Following Interstate Travel Direction

- As of 20 March 2020, the Prime Minister has announced:
 - a "human biosecurity emergency" has been declared under the Biosecurity Act 2015, allowing the Health Minister to issue targeted, legally enforceable directions and requirements to combat the virus;
 - a travel ban on all non-Australian residents and non-Australian citizens coming into Australia from 21:00 AEDT 20 March 2020;
 - all Australian residents and citizens arriving from overseas from 16 March 2020 will be required to self-isolate for 14 days;
 - the Australian Government will be issuing Isolation Declaration Cards (IDC) to all incoming travellers, asking if they 'understand the need to isolate for 14 days', while collecting personal information for public health follow up by the states and territories. Travellers will be requested to complete the card at all international airports from 06:00 AEDT 20 March.
 - o cruise ships from international ports will be banned from docking in Australia for 30 days:
 - the national Cabinet endorses the advice of the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC) to introduce additional social distancing measures;

- the Australian Health Sector Emergency Response Plan for Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) has now moved to the Targeted Action stage;
- non-essential outdoor organised gatherings should be limited to fewer than 500 people.
 Major events have since been cancelled; non-essential indoor gatherings should be limited to fewer than 100 people. WA Mass Gatherings Directions
- o residents of aged care homes will only be able to have one visit per day, of no more than two people; Aged Care Facilities Directions

- On 21 March 2020 the WA Minister for Health announced:
 - the cessation of all Category 3 elective surgeries from Tuesday 24 March. No new Category 2 elective surgeries will be booked from Monday 23 March.
 - o new guidelines for hospital visitors will be introduced on Monday 23 March.

- <u>Limits on dispensing and sales of medicines</u> Medicine supplies in Australia are strong, however demand for medicines has increased markedly over the past two weeks, resulting in some community pharmacies and wholesalers reporting temporary strain on the supply of some medicines.

Information for Employers and Employees

- It is not possible for employees to provide medical certificates if they have been declined a test for COVID-19. People who do not have symptoms SHOULD NOT be tested.

Summary of other key information

• Travel for WA Health Staff - Due to the international outbreak of COVID-19, the State Government has recently banned non-critical, work-related international travel for public sector employees, effective immediately. To protect our staff and patients, WA Health has decided to extend this ban to include all funded international work-related travel, including sponsored travel.
