COVID-19 Case numbers

- As of 1 September 2020, there have been 655 confirmed cases of COVID-19 notified in Western Australia (WA) and 30 historical cases. 641 people have recovered.
- To date 345,214 COVID-19 tests have been conducted in WA.

Living with COVID

Emergency accommodation for frontline COVID-19 Emergency Response and Health Care Workers (ERHCW)

Four accommodation providers have been awarded an initial 6-month contract to provide emergency accommodation to emergency and health care workers who need to self-quarantine or self-isolate close to work if they are unable to do so safely in their own homes.

This arrangement is available to Department of Health, Department of Fire & Emergency Service, Western Australian Police Force, St John Ambulance service and Royal Flying Doctor Service frontline staff who might be regularly exposed to COVID-19 patients and cannot isolate at home because they live with people who are at-risk or who are also healthcare workers. Accessing emergency accommodation through this standardised procurement process will generate savings for WA agencies.

Aged Care

Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC) <u>statement</u> on the national COVID-19 response for residential aged care facilities statement has been published. A time-limited AHPPC Aged Care Advisory Group will be established to support the national public health emergency response to COVID-19 in aged care. The Advisory Group will bring together expertise about the aged care sector, infection control, emergency preparedness and public health response.

Events and mass gatherings - position statement

Events of any size are permitted (except music festivals), with a minimum of 2 square metres required per person (subject to standard approvals processes). The WA Government is committed to supporting event organisers in a way that also ensures public health and safety are prioritised. A protocol is currently being developed under which COVIDsafe events may be permitted.

Directions for Maritime, Rig and Platform Crew

These Directions require all Maritime, Rig or Platform crew entering WA (from outside Australia or from another state) to quarantine in a state (SHICC) managed quarantine centre/hotel.

Regular testing of interstate freight drivers

Any truck driver entering WA is required to present for testing every 7 days while in WA (up until they have been in WA for 14 days). See our <u>Transport, Freight and Logistics Directions FAQs</u>.

Presentation for testing Directions (NO 4)

All interstate arrivals are now subject to a requirement to present for testing on Day 11 after arrival in WA. See our <u>factsheet on the Presentation for Testing Directions</u>.

DETECT schools' program

To date 10,812 tests have been performed on school staff and students with zero positive cases.

Testing

General population testing criteria

Any person may be tested if they have any one of the following clinical criteria: fever (\geq 37.5^oC) OR history of fever (e.g. night sweats, chills), without a known source **OR** an acute respiratory infection (e.g. shortness of breath, cough, sore throat), **OR** acute loss of smell or taste.

Testing locations

Testing locations are listed on Healthy WA.

Reporting

Notify suspected COVID-19 cases by completing the notification form either <u>ONLINE</u> or by printing out the notification form.
