COVID-19 Case numbers

- As of 30 June 2020, there have been 611 confirmed cases of COVID-19 notified in Western Australia (WA). 598 people have recovered.
- To date 182,513 COVID-19 tests have been conducted in WA.

COVIDSafe App

The Australian Government's COVIDSafe app is voluntary and is available in 63 languages. Approximately 6.5 million people in Australia have downloaded the app, and according to the federal health minister, Greg Hunt, that meets the government's target of 40% of the population as he defined it – being 40% of the Australian population with smartphones. Latest Updates

WA ready for the next phase of the COVID-19 Roadmap

Due to the world-leading response to COVID in WA, COVID-19 restrictions were further relaxed on Saturday 27 June as WA's roadmap was updated.

Next phases

Phase 5 is planned to be introduced on Saturday, 18 July and will result in the removal of the 2sqm rule. It is also expected to see the removal of all gathering restrictions, other COVID-related rules introduced by the State Government and the 50 per cent capacity limit for major venues. <u>Next</u> <u>Phases</u>

A tentative date for the removal of WA's hard border was planned to be included as part of Phase 6, however, this was put on hold due to the rapidly evolving situation in Victoria.

Victoria Update

WA Health is closely monitoring the situation in Victoria, where there are now 2,099 reported cases of COVID-19, with 271 of these cases not having a known infection source. Over the next 10 days, the Victorian Department of Health and Human Services will facilitate a targeted COVID-19 testing blitz with priority hot spots the focus. A highly experienced WA Public Health official has been deployed to Victoria to support the escalating public health response. WA is also providing remote contact tracing support.

Restrictions lifted on public school boarding facilities and school camps

From Thursday 18 June, restrictions on the number of students who can occupy dormitory-style accommodation at public school residential boarding facilities and school camps <u>have been lifted</u>. School camps can fill their dormitories but must continue to comply with the limit of 100 people, as part of the State's Phase 3 guidelines developed by the WA Chief Health Officer.

DETECT Snapshot Picture of wellness

More than 18,500 adults were tested for COVID-19 in the DETECT Snapshot program with no positive cases.

Lotterywest relief fund supports WA Community

The State Government has delivered almost \$6 million to support 70 not-for-profit community groups and local government authorities through the <u>Lotterywest COVID-19 Relief Fund</u>. The Fund supports vulnerable Western Australians and those experiencing hardship during this unprecedented time.

DETECT schools' program

To date 3,652 tests have been performed on school staff and students with no positive cases.

Directions Updates

Testing

General population testing criteria

Any person may be tested if they have any one of the following clinical criteria: fever (≥37.5^oC) OR history of fever (e.g. night sweats, chills), without a known source OR an acute respiratory infection (e.g. shortness of breath, cough, sore throat).

Testing locations

Testing locations are listed on Healthy WA.

Reporting

Notify suspected COVID-19 cases by completing the notification form either <u>ONLINE</u> or by printing out the notification form.

Testing of asymptomatic patients

The purpose of the <u>Testing Directions</u> is to prohibit a person from requesting or conducting testing for COVID-19 except in accordance with these directions. Testing asymptomatic patients is permitted in several settings, approval for each of these scenarios can be found <u>here</u>. Asymptomatic testing should not be performed for return to work purposes or fit for work purposes, unless requested or approved by Public Health.

Series of National Guidelines (SoNG)

The latest iteration released on 23 June 2020 includes an update to enhanced testing criteria and definition of COVID-19 death.
