Helping hands

Over 30 people, including staff from the City, their family and friends made the trip

to New Norcia to plant over almost 2,000 native species for National Tree Day on 28 July.

This annual event strengthens the City's friendship with the New Norcia Benedictine Community. Plantings help towards the restoration of the Moore River upper embankment and help to address some of the problems the area faces through drought, rising salinity levels, loss of habitat and soil erosion.

City Bids Farewell to Longest Serving CEO



IN JULY, the City of South Perth bid farewell to its longest standing CEO, Cliff Frewing after ten years of service.

Cliff's career spans over 40 years in local government with his first role in the finance department at the City of Perth in the 1970s.

He took on the role as treasurer at the City of Subiaco in 1980 before moving on to the then Shire of Swan as director of finance in 1986.

In 2001 he was seconded to the City of South Perth as the interim CEO during a period of instability and stayed for two years before returning to the Shire of Swan. During this time, Cliff managed the City through a period of turmoil, restored the City's reputation for good governance and created a secure work culture for the staff.

Cliff rejoined the City of South Perth in 2005 and has since held the reins of the beautiful foreshore city.

During his time as CEO, the City of South Perth saw significant developments with the sale of the Civic Triangle, which generated \$27.3 million in revenue for the City and the commencement of the Manning Community Hub that will deliver a modern community facility incorporating a variety of community resources for the Manning and wider South Perth area.

A strong advocate for the protection and rehabilitation of the City's foreshore,

Cliff campaigned to state and federal government for funds to replace the river walls either side of Mends Street Jetty.

Cliff's legacy will be seen in current projects underway in the City including the development of Node 5 Mill Point as part Mr Glass is due to commence at the City in October 2015 and brings with him a wealth of experience from the public and private sectors



of the South Perth Foreshore Strategy and Management Plan and the completion of the Sir James Mitchell Park Promenade.

Cliff loved the foreshore city and could often be found strolling along Sir James Mitchell Park during his lunch break, enjoying the view and chatting with outside workers.

Whilst there are no immediate plans for the seasoned chief executive, he will be taking a much-needed vacation.

City of South Perth directors Michael Kent, Mark Taylor and Vicki Lummer will be sharing the responsibilities of the CEO until the official appointment of Geoff Glass.

Breathing new life into the suburb of Karawara, the City is involved in a variety of small events and projects in partnership with the Gowrie and a local residents' group.



Picture South Perth -Royal Perth Golf Club



IN MAY, THE CITY and Royal Perth Golf Club worked together to record five oral histories with some of the Club's longest-standing members, including some of its past presidents. In addition, over 100 photographs from the Club's history dating back to the early 1900s have been digitised and are now available to view online via the City's Picture South Perth website.

The oral histories have captured the spirit and stories of the Club that was founded at a meeting of 12 gentlemen in the Government House Ballroom in August 1895.

Players used 'the Links', a portion of Burswood Island until 1900 when a more appropriate location was needed for the course due to rough terrain, weed problems, periodic river flooding and difficulties getting to and from the island in an old rowing barge. A more suitable site was selected at Wattle Grove Farm in Belmont where a nine-hole course was established for the 49 members.

Eight years later, the Club was moved to the current South Perth location, just 10 minutes from the City and was officially opened by Sir Frederick Bedford, then Governor of Western Australia on 2 August, 1908.

The course began with nine holes and its first clubhouse was built in 1914, by which time the course had been extended to 18 holes. It grew rapidly in members immediately after the war ended in November 1918. The club was then granted Royal Charter in 1937, an honour shared by only one other golf club in W A, Royal Fremantle Golf Course. The message proclaiming its new status was received from the Governor, Sir James Mitchell on behalf of King George VI.

As any member of the club today will say, the real pride of the club lies in its members and their stories, in the friendships and sportsmanship that can only truly develop from a love of the game and a course that feels like home.



Major Projects

Mill Point Concept Plans Released



AS PART OF the City's South Perth Foreshore Strategy and Management Plan (SPF Plan), the City released concept plans for the development of Mill Point.

One of ten nodes in the SPF Plan, Mill Point has been identified as Node 5. It will be developed as a cultural and heritage hub, with improvements to the beach area, both pedestrian and cycle routes, along with the ecology and amenities of Millers Pool.

The Node 5 Mill Point concept plans incorporate strategies from the SPF Plan outlined for the Mill Point foreshore node.

These include:

Planting of native vegetation at Millers Pool and near the Old Mill
Beach and headland additions

- Upgrade of carpark
- Amenity improvements including picnic and seating areas with shelters and shady trees
- Improved pedestrian paths connecting to a boardwalk over the pool and a small jetty
- Potential single storey café/restaurant
- Potential food van area

Feedback collected on the concept plans during July and August will be used to finalise the Node 5 Mill Point Plan. Construction of Stage I of the project is scheduled to commence in early 2016.

Hayman Road and Thelma Street Roundabout

THE HAYMAN ROAD and Thelma Street intersection in Kensington was nominated by the Main Roads WA 2015-2016 Black Spot program as a result of the right-angled crashes and many near misses it has witnessed over the last 10 years.

The project was also identified in the City's Local Area 8 Traffic Management Study as an intersection that required investigation. In a 2014 count, Hayman Road carried approximately 14,680 vehicles per day.

The Federal Government has contributed \$530,000 to the funding of the design and construction of a proposed multi-lane roundabout at Hayman Road and Thelma Street.

The proposed roundabout is set to improve traffic flows and safety for all modes of transport with significant upgrades proposed for cycling and pedestrian connectivity. The City will be responsible for the design of the roundabout and the management of the construction phase. Design plans have been released and will be open for comment from until 15 September 2015.

Construction is proposed for January to February 2016. More information can be found on the City's website or phone 9474 0777. ■

Canning Highway #ShapeOurPlace



OVER 80 PEOPLE attended a community workshop on I August to discuss draft Maximum Building Height Plans released as part of the second phase of the Canning Highway #ShapeOurPlace precinct study.

The City of South Perth's draft Local Housing Strategy (2012) identified that there are challenges for the City between managing high-density development along Canning Highway and the adjacent lowdensity residential areas.

As a result, the City is reviewing existing and future building appearance along Canning Highway and the adjacent lowdensity suburbs.

Phase one of the study involved feedback from the community on Facebook using #ShapeOurPlace, a community workshop and email submissions that ran between March and April 2015. The draft Maximum Building Height Plans were released as part of the second phase of the project and feedback closed in August 2015.

Thank you to everyone who has participated in the project so far. Comments will be used to form a final report and recommendations to Council to initiate amendments to the Town Planning Scheme.

City-Wide Parking Strategy

THE CITY OF SOUTH PERTH

is preparing a City-wide Parking Strategy that will provide a long-term plan for the provision and management of parking within the City.

The strategy aims to provide a parking framework over the next 15 years to assist in achieving the City's goals in relation to travel demand management and sustainable transport, to ensure the existing road network amenity is maintained and improved.

Feedback collected during July to August 2015 will be used to create a draft Parking Strategy and will be released for further comment in October to November 2015. More information can be found on the Major Projects page on the City's website.

Community Update

Is Your Dog Microchipped?

THE DOG ACT 1976

provides that on and after I November 2015, the owner of a dog that has reached three months of age must ensure that the dog is microchipped.

How do I get my dog microchipped?

A veterinarian (vet), vet nurse or a person with the relevant qualifications from a registered training provider is able to implant a microchip in your dog.

To find out how you can arrange for your dog to be microchipped, contact your regular vet or the City to obtain information on where

I'm lost without my microchip you can take your dog to be microchipped.

My dog is old and unwell, is it still required to be microchipped?

A dog is exempt from the microchipping requirement if a vet issues a certificate stating that the implantation of a microchip in the dog may adversely affect the health and welfare of the dog. Such a certificate cannot apply in respect of a dog that is under three months of age.

When will I be required to prove my dog is microchipped?

When you re-register your dog, you will be required to provide proof that the dog has been microchipped, by providing the City with the microchip number.

How will microchipping my dog assist me?

If you lose your microchipped dog, it will make it easier for you to be reunited. The dog's microchip can be scanned by a ranger or a vet, which will reveal the owner's contact details.

If your dog is impounded and it is discovered that it has not been microchipped, you may be liable for a fine. As a result, it is in your best interests to ensure your dog is microchipped.

What happens if I do not get my dog microchipped?

A person who fails to ensure their dog is microchipped on and after 1 November 2015 is liable for a fine of up to \$5,000.

Hard Waste Collection 2015

THE CITY provides one hard waste collection per year.

Please assist the City by placing hard rubbish on your own verge and into separate piles:

- metals
- whitegoods
- mattresses
- e-waste
- general waste

Please ensure your waste is out before 7am on the date shown on the map for your area, as your street may be the first cleared. Waste not out by the specified date WILL NOT be removed.

Only four cubic metres of waste will be collected from each residence. Waste left behind after the collection has finished is your responsibility and must be removed from the verge within seven days or \$200 -\$500 litter infringements will be issued.



Asbestos **Disposal Day**

Asbestos cement (AC) building products are not a health risk if left undisturbed in buildings. However, safe work procedures must be followed to remove it.

Asbestos needs to be handled with extreme caution to minimise the release of potentially harmful fibres.



The City's next Asbestos Disposal Day: When: 10am-2pm, Saturday 17 October 2015 Where: Collier Park Waste Transfer Station, 199 Thelma Street, Como

Asbestos must be double wrapped in industrial thick black plastic (min 200um) and securely gaffer taped. There is a maximum of 3 fence sheets per household.



Know Your Suburb

KARAWARA is an Aboriginal Nyungar word, meaning 'green'. The name of 'Karawara' was chosen by the South Perth City Council when the original subdivision commenced in October 1962, and was approved as the suburb name in 1973. Cul-de-sac names within the subdivision reflect the Aboriginal theme.

In the Neighbourhood Watch Front

SAFETY AND CRIME prevention was boosted recently, when residents from the Cities of South Perth, Melville, Canning, Gosnells, Victoria Park and East Fremantle came together to discuss measures at two information sessions.

Held by the WA Police's Eyes on the Street program, the 'Who You Gonna Call' information sessions were attended by more than 70 residents

The sessions highlighted the importance of reporting information to Police and community members' role in contributing towards safer communities.

Residents were encouraged to get to know their neighbours and look out for each other.

Session attendees were told community safety could be boosted simply by exchanging phone numbers with neighbours, joining ewatch or volunteering with Neighbourhood Watch.

Participants learnt how to be more observant; recall important details for Police reports; and share vital information helpful to investigations.

A clear understanding of the correct numbers in different circumstances was also given, as listed right.


oncoming threat. Check your surroundings prior to using your phone or iPod and limit the time you allow others to see it while walking at night.
