Victoria Park have signed a Memorandum of Understanding which commits both Councils to a formalised working relationship and partnership for a period of at least three years. As neighbouring Councils, it makes absolute sense to work closely together on projects and issues that will impact residents and ratepayers in both communities. The agreement was signed by myself and CEO Geoff Glass along with the Town of Victoria Park's Mayor Trevor Vaughan and CEO Anthony Vuleta at the City's offices.

IN MAY, THE COUNCIL

ADOPTED a Parking Strategy that will provide a long-term plan for the management and provision of parking within the City.

Luxmore Parking and Safety Consultants were commissioned by the City to develop the Strategy which will provide a parking framework for the next 15 years to assist in achieving the City's goals in relation to travel demand management and sustainable modes of transport.

Additionally, it outlines 22 recommendations for review and implementation, identifying a comprehensive action plan to assist in the development of Management Plans for 14 Parking Control Areas (PCA) within the City including the South Perth Station Precinct.

One of the Strategy's key recommendations includes the formation of a Parking Working Group to assist in the effective delivery of the Strategy and Parking Management Plans, and the adoption of a 'demand management' approach whereby parking facilities can be proactively managed and used more effectively.

"The Strategy is clear in that the City needs to prioritise access for pedestrians, cyclists, public transport users and people with disabilities. Another priority is to make the most of the public transport infrastructure, balanced with the needs of the City road network, which includes working towards minimising congestion," Mayor Sue Doherty said.

In developing the Strategy, the City conducted extensive stakeholder

consultation including: workshops for local businesses and residents, a Parking Strategy survey, online forum discussions and an interactive online map for posting comments and suggestions relating to specific parking locations.

"Road safety around on-street parking was the overriding concern for the South Perth community. This concern was identified primarily in residential areas, around schools, Curtin University and along main arterial roads," Mayor Doherty said.

"The purpose of the Parking Strategy is to work towards the development of a City-wide Integrated Transport Plan. Further stakeholder engagement will form a component of this process with dates to be confirmed."

South Perth Station Precinct

IN APRIL 2016, Council endorsed Amendment No. 46 'South Perth Station Precinct' to the City's Town Planning Scheme. The amendment introduces development controls including absolute height limits and setbacks in the Precinct that will achieve the vision for the area, while protecting the amenity for the local residents. The amendment was referred to the Western Australian Planning Commission in May, and will then be referred to the Minister for Planning Hon. Donna Faragher MLC to make the final determination.

The Minister recently visited the City to be briefed on local issues including the future and vision for the Precinct and City, housing density and major projects. Mayor Sue Doherty gave the Minister an update

engaged consultants to review traffic, transport and access strategies. The use of 3D computer modelling to assist in the assessment of significant development applications within the City is also being explored.

"The Council is committed to responsibly managing development within the Precinct and balancing the needs of all stakeholders including local residents, ratepayers, developers, and acting for the good of the greater community as we move forward. Amendment No. 46 is about ensuring that further developments enhance the area, and make a positive contribution to this unique and iconic part of Perth," Mayor Doherty said.

Carnaby's Black Cockatoo Sanctuary



DURING THE PAST DECADE

the City of South Perth has been actively engaged in establishing and maintaining the sanctuary areas at Collier Park Golf Course to provide enhanced habitat for Carnaby's Black Cockatoos. With its tall pine and eucalyptus trees, the golf course is one of the largest roosting sites in the Perth metropolitan area for these magnificent birds. It is important to maintain existing stands of roosting trees and continue to plant new stock to ensure ongoing tree regeneration at the site.

Over a number of years, the City has secured funds from Perth Natural Resource Management (NRM) as well as Birds Australia for revegetation projects at the course. These projects continue to build on previous work done on the 91

hectare parcel of land and aim to enhance sanctuary areas and support the cockatoo's habitat through revegetation of non-play areas of the course with locally indigenous plant species.

Implementation of these projects involves extensive weed control, planting of native plant stock and pine trees, direct seeding, and smoke water application to the ground to encourage seed bank germination. As a result, over 40 sanctuary sites have been established and maintained over the past five years to provide food sources and roosting spaces for Carnaby's Black Cockatoos.

Recently the City has undertaken additional works to expand existing sanctuary areas

DID YOU KNOW...

- Carnaby's Black-Cockatoos are found only in Western Australia.
- Male Carnaby's Black-Cockatoos feed the female at her nest during the incubation period and fly over 12km to ensure she gets the food she needs during nesting.
- The cockatoos rarely use the same hollow to nest in if the breeding attempt the previous season was unsuccessful.
- The birds display strong bonds with their partners throughout their adult life.
- If two eggs are produced, the second egg is laid two to eight days after the first egg.
- The cockatoos can live for 40 to 50 years in the wild.
- Carnaby's Black-Cockatoo is endemic to southwest Western Australia, extending from the Murchison River to Esperance, and inland to Coroow, Kellerberrin and Lake Cronion.

Community Safety Why Should I Report Crime?



BY REPORTING CRIMINAL **ACTIVITY,** you can help the police solve crimes and prevent future crimes from taking place.

- If you don't report crime there will be: No investigation
- Very little chance that the offender will be caught or brought to justice
- More people may suffer what you've been through
- No clear picture of crime across your neighbourhood, making it harder for police to deal with future problems.

For every crime reported the police will:

- Carry out an investigation, looking at the details of the crime including any potential evidence
- · Examine to see if it is linked to other crimes. If so, then the local police may direct extra resources to the area to prevent other people from becoming victims of crime

- Log any property involved, which will be returned to you if recovered
- your concerns about what happened.

Incidents involving stolen property, theft from vehicles, break-ins, anti-social and threatening behaviour should be reported to police on 131 444.

For life threatening situations call 000.

Know Your Suburb-South Perth



SOUTH PERTH derives its name from its location south of Perth. The area was identified as a separate suburb of Perth in 1831 and the name now applies not only to the City, but also to the suburb.

Development of South Perth was slow because there was little need for a 'suburb' at that time. By the end of the 1890s, the population was about 400. Today, the population exceeds 12,000 people.

Key attractions within the suburb of South Perth include The Old Mill, Perth Zoo,

Royal Perth Golf Club, Sir James Mitchell Park and Mends Street Jetty, just to name a few!
