National Broadband Network

Residents in parts of Manning, Salter Point and Como are now able to experience the benefits of fast broadband following the official switch-on of the national broadband network (nbn) in January 2016. Eligible homes and businesses have 18 months to make the switch before the nbn network replaces existing landline and internet services.

2016 Australia Day Active Citizenship Awards and City of South Perth Citizen of the Year Awards

Over 500 people attended the City of South Perth's annual Australia Day 2016 Citizenship Ceremony held in the morning on Sir James Mitchell Park. on 27 January, former City of South Perth Councillor Kevin Trent OAM RFD JP was bestowed with the great honour of being awarded the title of Honorary Freeman of the City.

Autumn Green Waste Collection

AUTUMN is a great time to rejuvenate a garden for the new season and get prepared for winter storms by trimming back overhanging vegetation and tree branches. As it is very dangerous to trim trees anywhere near power lines, the City recommends that you hire a professional pruner or arborist to trim vegetation close to power lines.

Autumn Green Waste Verge Side Collection – 11 April to 20 May 2016

The City will collect:

- Uncontaminated green/garden waste
- Tree prunings/branches with a maximum diameter of 150mm and maximum length of 1.5m
- Maximum 3cu m per premise.

All material for collection is to be neatly placed on the verge with cut ends toward the street.

The City won't collect:

- Lawn clippings and leaves. These may be placed in your regular bin and will be collected along with your weekly domestic rubbish collection
- General junk, building or household waste
- Tree trunks and stumps larger than 150mm in diameter or 1.5m in length
- Dug out lawn
- Green waste that is contaminated by household rubbish
- Bags or boxes of leaves and lawn clippings.

If the green waste you set out for collection does not comply, it will not be collected. Please see additional information on the City's website. ■

To assist residents to drop off recyclables and waste material, the Collier Park Waste Transfer Station will now be open from 8am (instead of 9am) to 4.45pm, Monday to Sunday, as part of a four-month trial ending 1 May 2016.



Manning Community Hub - James Miller Oval Upgrade

AN UPGRADE OF James Miller Oval in Manning will be taking place in early 2016 as part of the Manning Community Hub project. The City will be replacing the playing surface and the irrigation system, adding new path access connections, formalising the verge car parking, relocating and upgrading the playground, installing additional park furniture and demolishing the existing clubrooms.

The playing surface and irrigation replacement is scheduled to be completed by April 2016. The path connections, verge car parking, playground, park furniture and demolition of the existing clubrooms are scheduled to take place once the construction of the Manning Community Hub is completed in late 2016.

River Wall Works Between the Narrows Bridge and Jet Ski Ramp

Upgrade of the damaged river wall and revetment between the Narrows Bridge and jet ski ramp, on the eastern side of the bridge commenced in October 2015 and was completed in time for Australia Day 2016. The project was funded by the Swan River Trust and the City of South Perth.

The works replaced the existing revetment and river wall with taller walls designed to mitigate foreshore erosion and predicted sea level rise. The style is similar to the opposite side of the river, north east of the Old Swan Brewery.

Landscape works remain including fine grading, irrigation upgrades and new planting to be undertaken after the heat of summer during autumn.

Mill Point Beach and Headlands Construction

South Perth foreshore restoration works at Mill Point (east of the Narrows Bridge), commenced in February 2016 and are scheduled for completion by May 2016.

Works include the construction of three headlands and two beaches to control foreshore erosion and improve the amenity of the area.

These works are part of the City's 2015/16 Capital Works Program and are the initial stage of the Node 5 Mill Point Plan of the South Perth Foreshore.

Millers Pool


Planning for the Millers Pool project has progressed and will follow on from the beach and headlands construction.

Draft plans for the area surrounding Millers Pool are currently with Department of Parks and Wildlife (DPAW), Rivers and Estuaries Division (previously Swan River Trust) for their approval, with related statutory approvals including Department of Water.

The concept plans and information are available on the City's website, including the latest plan showing the general layout and planting around Millers Pool, the next stage of the Mill Point plan.

Following all necessary approvals, the plans will be finalised for Council approval, tender and planned construction in 2016. ■

Resonance

When: This permanent work will be available to view from late April
Where: Mends St Promenade, South Perth

Sitting on a site once overwhelmed with black swans in the 1600s, Resonance pays respect to its new location and its century old changing landscape. These three sculptural feathers are symbolic of the abundant bird life that once stood on these shores but more deeply, speaks of the spirits of people past, present and future.

Standing tall in bronze, their central spines reveal anecdotes and memories of our local Nyungar families and the first recollections of early explorers de Vlamingh and James Stirling. Whispering from the 1940s, the feathers speak of a time where the land was used by the grazing dairy cattle and the resourceful migrant Chinese market gardeners who once supplied the local community with the fruit of their crops.

Traditionally a ceramic artist, Resonance takes artist Amanda Shesher's practice to new heights, revealing new form and medium whilst examining the theme of our human need to connect with nature.

Security Stepped Up

SECURITY WAS IMPROVED this Australia Day on South Perth foreshore with Downer Group supplying the City of South Perth a Solar CCTV unit, a fully self-sufficient unit using solar panels to power the cameras, storage, and communications, without the need for generators, power cables or permanent infrastructure.

The City was able to log into the CCTV system using either a laptop, tablet or mobile phone to view and control the cameras from anywhere with mobile phone coverage. High definition PTZ cameras were mounted to the top of the hydraulically operated rotatable mast where a 360 degree view of the area could be achieved. ■

Record crowds celebrate Australia Day in South Perth

THE CITY OF SOUTH PERTH celebrated Australia Day 2016 on a picture perfect day at Sir James Mitchell Park, South Perth, drawing in record crowds.

Celebrations began with the City's Australia Day Citizenship Ceremony in the morning, with the delivery of the Australian flag to Her Excellency the Honourable Kerry Sanderson AO, Governor of Western Australia through an incredible water ski show performed by Water Ski WA.

65 new citizens were welcomed by Mayor Sue Doherty and Federal Member for Swan Steve Irons MP, joining the community from over 27 different countries.

From 3pm, spanning over 10 hectares along the South Perth foreshore, the City of South Perth's Celebration Zone once again provided families the opportunity to come together and enjoy Australia Day in a safe, friendly, alcohol and smoke-free environment.

With seven activity areas suitable for children from toddlers to teens, the Celebration Zone welcomed a record crowd of 70,000 people this year.

Volunteers from Soroptimist International Club of South Perth (SISP) also assisted on the day, managing donation tins at the entry points into the Celebration Zone to raise funds for the Waroona and District Fires Appeal 2016.

The large crowds continued to grow outside of the Celebration Zone as the City of Perth's Skyworks treated crowds along the Swan River to a 360-degree laser light show for the first time.

The City wishes to thank everyone that helped make Australia Day 2016 a great success. ■



Australia Day Award Winners

THE PREMIER'S AUSTRALIA DAY ACTIVE CITIZENSHIP AWARDS and City of South Perth Citizen of the Year Awards are run concurrently each year. These prestigious awards foster, recognise and celebrate significant contributions to community life and active citizenship. The winners for the three categories were presented their awards by the Member for South Perth John McGrath MLA and Mayor Sue Doherty.

City of South Perth Citizen of the Year and Premier's Australia Day Active Citizenship Award - Cecilia Brooke

Cecilia's community involvement started at the young age of 12 - reading children's stories on a local radio station and also joining the National Catholic Girls Movement, becoming a member of the State Committee by 16. This sparked the beginning of Cecilia's involvement and active service within her local community.

In the early 1980's, Cecilia joined Soroptimist International supporting groups such as the Royal Flying Doctors, and many community activities. Cecilia founded the Chiropractic Assistants Association of Australia and was highly involved in organising events including breakfast with guest speakers every three

months and in 1997 was awarded the Chiropractic Association Award.

Cecilia has also been involved with World Vision, the Cancer Council and the Lotus Children's Orphanage and is currently the Chairperson of the City of South Perth Residents Association and an active member of the Soroptimist International Club of South Perth.

The Premier's Australia Day Active Citizenship Award acknowledges Cecilia's lifetime of service to the community and contribution within the City of South Perth.

City of South Perth Young Citizen of the Year and Premier's Australia Day Active Young Citizen Award - Alisha McMullen

Alisha actively promotes community services to her peers and has been a prominent member of the Penrhos Community Representative Team over the past few years. Alisha has linked in with various organisations within the community in order to donate all the items she has managed to make, gather from students or collect from local businesses.

This year Alisha has initiated and coordinated the Tea Jar Project which saw



decorated jars of tea donated to Southcare, Juniper Aged Care Facility, South Perth Meals on Wheels, a local women's refuge and the South Perth Senior Citizens Centre.

She has also volunteered her time at Identity WA supervising children with disabilities on outings and volunteered at the 2015 Heart Kids Ball. Alisha has raised money for Lifeline, Heart Foundation and for remote villages in Laos. Alicia is now currently planning to design and sell t-shirts with profits raised going to the Esther Foundation, based in South Perth.

City of South Perth Premier's Australia Day Active Community Group or Event Award - Soroptimist International Club of South Perth

Soroptimist International Club of South Perth is part of an international organisation for women and formed as a club in South Perth 17 years ago. The group of 35 women have been working in the community over this time to improve the lives of women, girls and families in need. The group is very active in the local community, providing sports and educational scholarships to children in need, supporting women's refuges and homeless shelters and supporting the aged and disadvantaged. They have been involved with Southcare, South Perth Senior Citizens Centre, City of South Perth Australia Day Celebration Zone and Fiesta, International Women's Day, Beanies for the Homeless, Family Foundations Services, Starick Women's Refuge and the Cancer Council. ■

Know Your Suburb

SALTER POINT, named after Samuel August Salter (August 1849 - 1930), sawyer and timber contractor, who had a landing stage on the point first known as "Salter's Landing". Logs were floated down the Canning River from Kelmscott

and Jarrahdale to Salter's Landing for transportation to a mill by barge. Salter operated here around 1879 - 1881. This is the first known European activity in the area prior to the establishment of Clontarf Boys' Home in 1901. Samuel Salter was the

son of farmer Samuel Salter and Sarah Ellen Buckingham who arrived in WA as British migrants on the 'Diadem' in April 1842. At that time, Salter Point was virgin bushland. There was no access to the area by road, and could only be accessed from the river. ■


