THE MENDS STREET

PROMENADE on the South Perth foreshore was officially opened on 21 April 2016 by Hon Albert Jacob MLA, Minister for Environment; Heritage.

The first stage of the Promenade project was completed last year. This included extensive river wall works, with a new contemporary flat topped seat wall, curved to the river side to relieve foreshore erosion and predicted sea level rise.

New seating and lighting has been installed, and the surrounding turf replaced. The area is now even more attractive and welcoming for those visiting the City's beautiful riverside parks and beaches. The path, widened to over five metres, provides ample space for groups of people to walk along the foreshore.

Another recent addition to the area is Resonance, a permanent piece of public art installed in early April.

The three swan feathers, measuring up to 1.9m high, was created by Western Australian artist Amanda Shelsher. The sculpture symbolises the abundant bird life of South Perth waters and echoes the spirits of people past, present and future.



Standing tall in bronze, their central spines reveal anecdotes and memories of our local Nyungar families and the first recollections of early explorers de Vlamingh and James Stirling. Whispering from the nineteen forties, the feathers speak of a

time where the land was used by the grazing dairy cattle and the resourceful migrant Chinese market gardeners who once supplied the local community with the fruit of their crops.

The Promenade project is part of the Node I – Mends Street Piazza and Promenade in the South Perth Foreshore (SPF) Strategy and Management Plan, which prioritises ten foreshore Nodes and lists strategies for the future of this precious foreshore reserve.

With the Mends Street Promenade complete and officially opened, planning for the Piazza at Mends Street jetty continues. This important node acts as a major arrival point for many visitors to South Perth, and a gateway to Perth's new Elizabeth Quay on the north side of the river.

Why Road Works Are Important For Keeping Your City Safe

IF YOU HAVE NOTICED road work signs and bright orange traffic cones around the City, it just means that the infrastructure team has been very busy with the upcoming road rehabilitation works, scheduled throughout this year.

Did you know the City has 1.45million square metres of paving and around 40,000 square metres is re-surfaced each year?

Why undertake road works and pavement rehabilitation?

Road works support the maintenance of the City's road infrastructure. This ensures greater access for road users and improved safety, economic and social outcomes. Road works are undertaken to build new roads, maintain existing roads and complete emergency repairs.

Why are particular roads selected for rehabilitation?

Road conditions are rated against a range of criteria to determine the need and timing of preventative or remedial action to prevent loss of service. Typically, the rating would address the structure, surface cracking, ride-ability, predicted increases in traffic and age.

The timing and programming of rehabilitation works is critical.

Leaving a road for too long before carrying out preventative repairs or upgrades will cost extra in the long-term. This is why you may see a road being rehabilitated even though it appears to be in good condition.

Who funds these works?

The City allocates a portion of its annual expenditure each year to the improvement and preservation of its road network and also accesses state and federal government funding.

Road network capital expenditure 2015-2016

- City of South Perth contribution \$1,774,560
- State and federal funding \$943,000

How are road works coordinated by the City?

A lot of effort is put into coordinating the road works to minimise disruptions to residents, motorists and pedestrians. For example, road works located near residential areas are carried out mostly in the day, and road works near schools and busy roads are scheduled for non-peak hours.

Canning Highway #ShapeOurPlace Report Recommendations Adopted

THE FINAL REPORT and

recommendations from the Canning Highway #ShapeOurPlace project was adopted at the March Council meeting.

The report presents the results of a study into the residential density and built form of properties within approximately 100 metres of Canning Highway, including community consultation undertaken during 2015.

While Council endorsement of the study does not necessarily mean that all the

recommendations will be implemented, it does mean the City will progress with individual components of the larger #ShapeOurPlace study.

The Canning Highway #ShapeOurPlace project endorsement is the first step in a longer term project for the area and there will be many more opportunities for consultation in the near future.

Kensington and South Perth will be the first priorities for further planning in the

Canning Highway precinct. A character study of Kensington will be undertaken to provide a comprehensive review of the existing building stock and inform future development. This will be progressed in the coming months.

NAIDOC WEEK is an opportunity for all Australians to celebrate the rich history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

The theme of this year's NAIDOC Week celebrations, which run from 3-10 July, is Songlines or the oldest living narrative of the nation.

For Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, the Dreamtime describes a time when the earth, people and animals were created by ancestral spiritual beings.

Dreaming tracks crisscross Australia and trace the journeys of ancestral spirits as they created the land, animals and lores. These dreaming tracks are sometimes called Songlines as they record the travels of these ancestral spirits who 'sung' the land into life.

Through learning more about Songlines and how they connect people to Country and Country to people – we celebrate the history and diversity of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures - the oldest continuing cultures on the planet.

Green Waste Collection

TAKE ADVANTAGE OF Autumn green waste verge side collection and get ready for winter by trimming back overgrown vegetation and raking up the fallen leaves.

The City will collect:

- Uncontaminated green/garden waste
- Tree prunings/branches with a maximum diameter of 150mm and maximum length of 15m
- Maximum 3 cubic metres per premise

All material for collection is to be neatly placed on the verge with cut ends toward the street.

The City won't collect:

- Lawn clippings and leaves. These may be placed in your regular bin and will be collected along with your weekly domestic rubbish collection
- General junk, building or household waste

- Tree trunks and stumps larger than 150mm in diameter or 1.5m in length
- Dug out lawn
- Green waste that is contaminated by household rubbish
- Bags or boxes of leaves and lawn clippings

If the green waste you set out does not comply, it will not be collected. Visit the City's website for specific collection dates for the final stages and additional information.

Missed your collection date?

Visit the City's Collier Park Waste Transfer Station to dispose of additional waste and recycling.

City 'Tops' in Recycling

CITY OF SOUTH PERTH

has been recognised as a State Top Collector by MobileMuster, collecting 27.9 kilos of mobile phones and mobile phone batteries to recycle since April 2015. That's equivalent to about 150 phones and 200 mobile phone batteries!

Thirty local councils from around Australia are in the running for a Top Recycler award in this year's MobileMuster Local Government Awards, with the winners to be announced in June.

IN JANUARY the City began The Bench Talk Project, an initiative which aimed to capture the stories of our local community. A group of City staff and volunteers from the South Perth Youth Network (SPYN) were trained in how to interview and record community stories.

They visited five different summer events around the City between January and April and set up a pop-up bench and invited members of the community to sit on the bench to share a story about the local area.

Twenty-six stories were recorded on the bench and 42 stories were shared on our handwritten story cards. The stories will

become a part of the collective memory of the South Perth area and will be shared on a website called South Perth Stories, set to launch at the end of 2016.



When he was young, he wanted to buy a block in South Perth and there was no other way of getting here other than to swim the river. So he swam the river, with his clothes on his head, and he went to an auction and he bought about the third block along from where the ferry pulls in today. And they lived there for about, I think, 50-something years. That's my story." - Joyce Sheard

Know Your Suburb-Waterford



WATERFORD began as a subdivision of land formerly comprising of the Clontarf Boys' Home for orphaned or disadvantaged boys. It was owned by the Christian Brothers from 1901.

Edmund Rice, the founder of the Christian Brothers was born in the Irish town of Waterford where the first Christian Brothers' schools were founded, the name commemorates this connection.

The Christian Brothers were the owners and subdividers of the land south of Manning Road east of Elderfield Road.

The area of land involved was so large that the area became a suburb in its own right. The land originally formed part of the Clontarf Boys' Home, school and farm and was set on about 200 hectares along the Canning River.

Stage I of the subdivision of the land was approved in 1981, the subdivision proceeding in stages over many years. All street names within Waterford reflect the Irish theme of the original Christian Brothers, with streets such as Drogheda, Fermoy, Galway, Kilkenny, Limerick and Tralee.

Community Safety

Gone in Less Than 60 Seconds



THE GONE IN LESS THAN 60 SECONDS display car, constructed by Kensington PCYC volunteers, was part of the Community Safety display at the Angelo Street Marketplace.

The project demonstrates how quickly thefts from motor vehicles can happen, and that leaving valuable items such as phones and bags visible in an unattended vehicle increase the chances of this happening.

The vehicle contains items commonly stolen from cars, such as mobile phones, tablets and cash and features a television screen which displays actual CCTV footage of thefts from motor vehicles that occurred in less than 60 seconds.

The City plans to display the car at selected major events and crime hot spots.


