Manning Community Centre opens its doors

The City marked the opening of the Manning Community Centre on Saturday 11 February with an open day featuring family activities and entertainment.

Guests met the groups who are housed in this state-of-the-art facility and explored everything the Centre has to offer.

The multi-million dollar facility which was completed on schedule, includes the new Manning Library, Community Hall, Manning Child Health Clinic, Moorditj Keila Aboriginal Group, a sporting clubroom to house the Manning Rippers Football Club and Perth Blitz Gridiron Club, an early years' centre that is home of the Manning Toy Library and a new Manning Playgroup association.

"At \$17m this is the largest project the City has invested in," Mayor Doherty said. "I thank everyone who has been involved in the journey of this truly wonderful project and fantastic community facility."

"Strategically located close to the Manning Senior Citizen's Centre, the Men's Shed and Manning Primary School, the Centre is set to become a true 'hub' for the local community."

The Manning Community Centre is part of the Manning Community Hub. Further expansion of commercial activities is planned for the Hub in the future. The Manning Community Hub is bounded by Bradshaw Crescent, Conochie Crescent and Welwyn Avenue. ■

The new Manning Library opened its doors to the public in late January. Visitors to the library can expect to see some exciting changes and find new spaces to read, study, research and relax.

Self-check loan machines will enhance the customer service experience, offering 100 per cent self-service for library members. This means no waiting around in queues to borrow or renew your items and there is even a loan machine just for kids!

Works in your neighbourhood

Road works and pavement rehabilitation

Works include some or all of the following: resurfacing with stone mastic asphalt, replacement of street kerbing on same alignment, replacement/installation of stormwater drainage structures and replacement signage and road markings.

- Bessell Avenue – Canning Highway to Throssell Street

Stormwater Drainage

Works include upgrade of existing stormwater drainage networks to increase storage capacity and mitigate localised flooding within various urban catchments.

- Catchment 36: Elizabeth Street – Addison Street to Milson Street

- Catchment 32: Albert Street – Rose Avenue to Coode Street

- Catchment 34: Anstey Street – South Terrace to Hensman Street

- Catchment 15: Melville Parade – Hardy Street and Bowman Street

Traffic management

Works include installation of traffic calming measures.

- Mount Henry/Hope Avenue Intersection – Construction of roundabout

- Banksia Terrace – Installation of two one-way treatments

- Ley Street – Peterson Street to Cloister Avenue – Speed treatment

- Bessell Avenue – Canning Highway to Throssell Street – Slow points

Place + Design: South Perth Station Precinct

The City is reviewing the 2011 vision for the South Perth Station Precinct (SPSP), and undertaking a detailed study of the place and design development for this area, in collaboration with community members and other stakeholders.

Key issues that will be addressed include:

- Building height and mass, and its effect on streetscapes, neighbouring buildings, the public realm and views to and from the SPSP
- Key elements of building design and siting including setbacks, building articulation and aesthetics
- The extent and application of Special Design Areas within the City's Town Planning Scheme
- Management of traffic and movement through and around the SPSP by pedestrians, cyclists, buses and cars
- Management of parking within the SPSP
- Design of streetscapes and public spaces, including the retention and planting of trees.

The project is informed by the previous vision, consultant research and stakeholder input to date, including development that is currently occurring. Its primary focus will be on improving liveability, community benefit and built form outcomes within the SPSP.

Planning Design Forum

The project centres on a Planning Design Forum, to be held over five consecutive days from 13-17 March 2017. At the Forum, a team of urban planning, architecture, traffic and transport, and economic consultants will collaborate with City staff and nominated community representatives in a program of urban design and planning investigations. The key outcome of these investigations will be to articulate the desired future planning and design vision of the SPSP.

Up to 30 community members have been selected through an expression of interest process to represent a broad cross-section of the community. A number of local community groups will also be represented.

While the Forum is closed to the public, all community members are invited to view the work in progress at public

exhibitions held at the end of days three and five of the Forum. Interested community members are encouraged to come to the South Perth Community Hall at 5.45pm on Wednesday 15 March and 5pm on Friday 17 March to hear about the progress.

Once all plans and documents are finalised, an Open Day will be held in April to present the outcomes to the broader community.

By bringing a diverse group of interested people together to work through the various planning and design issues in the SPSP, the project will deliver a revised vision and an improved planning framework to ensure that vision will be realised.

Public art in the City

The City's inventory of distinct and diverse public artworks is set to grow with more than 20 new works scheduled to be installed throughout the City over the next three years.

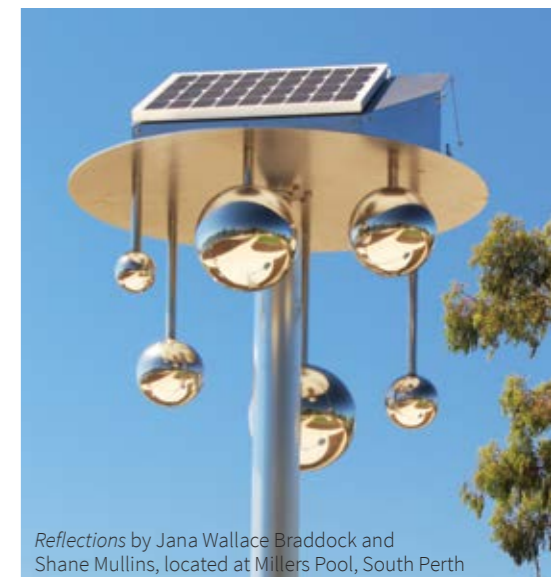
The artworks will contribute to the City's unique culture, while celebrating the identity and history of the community, enhancing the environment and contributing to a sense of place.

Western Australian artist Anne Neil's elegant series of sculptures known as *Dappled Light* is one of the most recent additions to the public art collection that has been delivered through the City's Developer Contribution policy. Located on the corner of Labouchere Rd and

Charles St in South Perth, the abstract works were installed in December 2016. They reference the natural environment and invite the community to touch and interact with the sculptural forms.

The Developer Contribution policy requires developers of projects with a value of \$4 million or greater to contribute at least 1% of the total project cost (excluding land value) towards public art. The contribution can be delivered as public art within the development itself, within the neighbouring precinct, or as a contribution to the City's Public Art Fund.

SPSP Parking Management Plan



The City is progressing towards the delivery of an area wide Parking Management Plan for the South Perth Station Precinct. The Working Party formed to assist the City in the development of this Plan met monthly from September to December 2016, with the final meeting held in February 2017.

The meetings were well attended and those present made valuable contributions while also taking the opportunity to ask questions. During the meetings, the City and its consultants, Cardno,

presented and sought feedback on the key recommendations for the ongoing management of parking within the Precinct as it transitions over the next one to three years.

There will be a period of consultation with the wider community prior to the South Perth Station Precinct Parking Management Plan being presented for Council's consideration.

City modifies Amendment No. 46 despite disappointment with Minister's changes

The City has modified its Town Planning Scheme Amendment No. 46 'South Perth Station Precinct' as it was legally required to following a determination by the WA Minister for Planning, Donna Faragher in December 2016.

Among the Minister's notable modifications are rejection of the City's attempt to deliver greater certainty to residents and developers through absolute height limits in the South Perth

Station Precinct as well as downgrading the requirements to provide commercial space that would have provided more local employment opportunities.

Amendment No. 46 comes into effect once it is published in the Government Gazette. ■

Autumn green waste collection

The City of South Perth provides two green waste verge side collections per year in spring and autumn.

Autumn is a great time to get out into the garden. Whilst the soil is still warm from the summer and before the winter rains arrive, this is the time to plant, prune and prepare for winter by trimming back overhanging vegetation and tree branches.

Autumn Green Waste Verge Side Collection – 3 April to 8 May 2017

The City will collect a maximum of three cubic metres per premise consisting of:

- Uncontaminated green/garden waste
- Tree prunings/branches with a maximum diameter of 150mm and maximum length of 1.5m

All material for collection should be neatly placed on the verge with cut ends toward the street.

The City won't collect:

- Lawn clippings and leaves. These may be placed in your regular bin and will be collected along with your weekly domestic rubbish collection
- General junk, building or household waste
- Tree trunks and stumps larger than 150mm in diameter or 1.5m in length
- Dug out lawn
- Green waste that is contaminated by household rubbish

If your green waste doesn't comply, it will not be collected. Please see additional information on the City's website at southperth.wa.gov.au/vergecollection ■

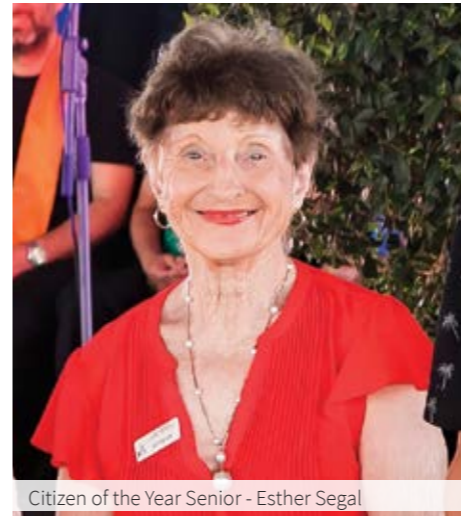
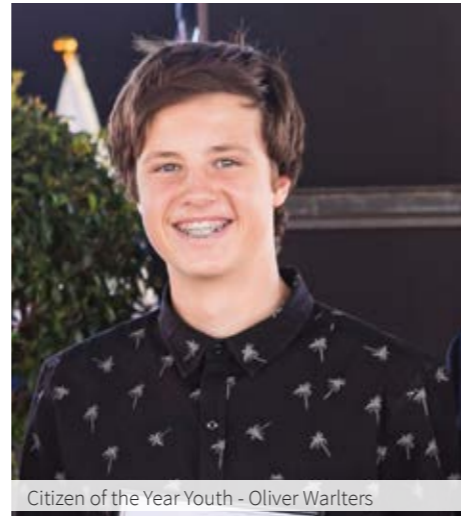

City saddened by Australia Day incident

The City was deeply saddened by the tragic incident and loss of life at this year's Australia Day Skyworks. On Thursday 26 January 2017, a seaplane involved in an aerial display crashed into the Swan River. The two people on board sadly did not survive.

In association with the City of Perth and the WA Police, the City made the decision to cancel the rest of the planned Celebration Zone activities on Sir James Mitchell Park in South Perth, out of respect to the deceased and their families.

"On behalf of the City, I offer my sincere condolences and deep sympathies to the families of the pilot and his passenger who lost their lives."
