Our Strategic Community Plan

The City embarked on a major review of its Strategic Community Plan in November 2016 through the Vision 2027 community and stakeholder engagement project.

Approximately 1,100 community members and stakeholders took part in the consultation, completing the Vision 2027 survey and attending workshops.

The draft plan was released for public comment in July 2017, with the final plan presented to Council and adopted at the September 2017 Council meeting.

This Strategic Community Plan 2017-2027 builds on our previous Strategic Community Plan 2013-2023. It is a long term, overarching strategy and planning document that outlines the community's aspirations and priorities for the future and sets out the key strategies required to achieve these.

CLONTARF-WATERFORD-SALTER POINT FORESHORE MASTERPLAN COMMUNITY FORUM

The City is developing a masterplan for the Clontarf - Waterford - Salter Point (CWSP) Foreshore, an extensive area of natural reserves, estuarine conservation wetlands and public open space that occupy approximately 34 hectares of Canning River foreshore land.

The masterplan will be the City's strategic guiding document for recreation, restoration and rehabilitation works on the CWSP Foreshore that addresses current and future management issues.

Consultation has commenced for stage one of the masterplanning process. At the end of stage one, a concept plan will be developed as the foundation for the masterplan.

A community forum in November will bring together community members, City representatives and planning officers for an open exchange of knowledge and ideas about the area and to share

the vision on current foreshore management and short, medium and longer-term landscaping possibilities.

The forum is one of a several ways the City is engaging the community towards developing a masterplan that provides a fair and robust framework for future planning decisions.

LOCAL HERITAGE INVENTORY AND HERITAGE LIST REVIEW

The City is conducting a review of its Local Heritage Inventory and Heritage List. As part of the review, the City invited the community to share their views on heritage in the City.

The Inventory identifies and celebrates buildings and places within the City that are worthy of recognition for their local cultural heritage significance.

Places identified as being in the highest significance categories on the Inventory will form the Heritage List adopted under the City's planning scheme. The Heritage List provides statutory protection for, and is used to inform the

management of, these buildings and places.

The preliminary community feedback period in September 2017 included a Community Information Session and heritage survey.

There will be further opportunity for owners of nominated properties to provide their feedback and be involved in the assessment process.

Once finalised, the draft Local Heritage Inventory and the Heritage List will be advertised for public comment before being adopted by Council.

Collins Street Centre mural takes shape

The City has commissioned contemporary visual artist Dr Simon Degroot to create a large-scale mural to enhance the front wall of Collins Street Centre.

Located at the corner of Collins and Shaftesbury Streets, South Perth, the Centre is an important hub and facility for a range of community groups.

Regular users of the Centre and neighbouring residents were invited to join Simon at an interactive workshop in October to develop

ideas and designs for the mural. Outcomes of the workshop were made available for the public to view at the Centre.

It is envisaged that the final design will be one that community members can identify with and be proud of, and will complement the community's use of the building and enhance the vicinity's character.

EJ Reserve - stage one nears completion

Construction works for stage one of the \$10.5m redevelopment of Ernest Johnson Reserve are progressing well with the main buildings nearing completion.

This first stage of the project remains on schedule for completion at the end of 2017, with user groups anticipated to move into the new facility in March 2018. The second stage, which will include demolition of existing buildings, works on the oval and construction of sports facilities, playgrounds and social areas, is scheduled to commence in early 2018.

A key initiative in the City's Strategic Community Plan, the reserve and its associated buildings are being redeveloped to better accommodate the needs of relevant sports clubs, community groups, the local community and the City, and produce a contemporary, functional and sustainable multi-purpose facility.

EJ Reserve is located in South Perth, bounded by South Tce, Sandgate St and Hensman St.

Connect South concept designs

A \$7.5 million major project, Connect South aims to invigorate the Mends Street precinct in South Perth. The first stage of the project focuses on Mends Street between Mill Point Road and the foreshore along with parts of the South Perth Esplanade. Stage one of the project will deliver a piazza on the foreshore as well as streetscape and amenity improvements, and landscaping upgrades on the north end of Mends Street.

An information session was held on 25 October at the Old Mill Theatre for the community and other stakeholders to view the concept designs for the first stage of the project. The community and other stakeholders will have the opportunity to provide feedback on the concept designs following the Council meeting on 21 November. Developer contribution to public art

In 2014, Council endorsed a policy requiring developers of projects with a value of \$4 million or greater to contribute at least 1% of the total project cost (excluding land value) towards public art. The contribution can be delivered as public art within the development itself, within the neighbouring precinct, or as a contribution to the City's Public Art Fund.

Two recently installed artworks acquired through the policy include:

Once was a Tree - Robin Yakinthou Wesley College, Swan St, South Perth

The sculpture represents a tree partially constructed of stainless steel pipe fittings, evoking an industrial aesthetic, while the Jarrah timber sections remind us of human folly, as the destruction of the world's forests occurs at a frightening rate.

Remnants - Mark Datodi and Steve Tepper Berrington Como, Cnr Murray St and McNabb Loop, Como

The abstract artworks take their inspiration from the pine trees located in and around Berrington Como. The fence panel artwork communicates the essence of the pine tree leaves, whilst the freestanding entry sculpture gestures at the geometry of the seed cones ■

Reducing water usage in the City

To reduce water use, the City employs a number of strategic water management practices.

In 2016, Council adopted its Water Efficiency Action Plan leading to the development of a Water Management Plan which will address corporate and community water management, including water conservation and water quality.

Central irrigation management system

The City's central irrigation management system (CIMS) controls irrigation and monitors water usage throughout our parks and reserves. The system is linked to a weather station at Ryrie Reserve in Como which records air temperature, rainfall and humidity. The information is used to tune the amount of water required for the reserves dependent on the conditions. The weather station also has the ability to suspend watering once a pre-determined amount of daily rainfall is reached.

Irrigation controllers

Irrigation controllers monitor conditions in parks and reserves during watering cycles. If these conditions are breached the

watering cycle will stop, a fault is relayed to the CIMS which in turn sends out an alarm to the City's reticulation technician's smart phone so they can attend to that fault as a priority.

Bores

Flow meters installed in the City's bores capture data which City officers use for monitoring and managing water consumption as well as reporting water use to the Department of Water.

Hydro and eco-zoning

The City's parks and reserves are designed and managed with the principles of water sensitive urban design. This includes hydro-zoning whereby vegetation with similar water needs are grouped together, to enable more efficient and responsible use of irrigation water. Eco-zoning is the conversion of existing turf areas into native garden areas. Ultimately this allows for minimal water to support an area that once sustained turf, saving large volumes of water.

RECYCLING PROGRAMS

The City's Recycling Centre offers a range of services for residents including free recycling of e-waste, scrap metal, cardboard, uncontaminated used motor oil, fluorescent lights, household and vehicle batteries and polystyrene.

The Recycling Centre has free garden recycling bags for residents

Fill the bags with green waste or recyclable material and drop them back at the Centre, free of charge. Once collected, these materials are shredded and composted into garden mulch which is also free for residents. The bags can be used for collecting up to 120 litres of mulch. Limited supply available, two per resident until stocks last only, not for commercial operators.

Asbestos Awareness Month

Australia has one of the highest rates of asbestos-related diseases in the world. This November Asbestos Awareness Month aims to educate Australians about the dangers of asbestos in and around homes and how best to manage it.
