Local government elections



Local government elections will take place on Saturday 21 October 2017.

The City of South Perth holds postal elections, which are conducted on its behalf by the Western Australian Electoral Commission.

Voting in a local government election is not compulsory in Western Australia, however all electors are strongly encouraged to vote.

Candidates nominating for council have from 7 - 14 September 2017 to lodge a nomination.

Election voting packages are posted to all electors of the City approximately three weeks before Election Day.

Every person enrolled on either the Residents Roll or the Non-Residents Owners and Occupiers Roll will be sent a postal vote and invited to complete the ballot and return it to the City by 6pm on Election Day.

Praise for Millers Pool



The City's restoration of Millers Pool on the South Perth foreshore has been recognised by the Australian Institute of Landscape Architects at an awards ceremony held in Perth in July.

From a record 46 entries, 20 winners were crowned across 13 categories, with Millers Pool receiving the prestigious Land Management Landscape Architecture Award.

Completed in December 2016, the project was commended as an exemplary multidisciplinary project incorporating

engineering, landscape, art, recreational and environmental components.

Part of the City's South Perth Foreshore Strategy and Management Plan, the Millers Pool project improves amenity, access and natural features of the Mill Point foreshore.

Landscape, environmental and amenity improvements include picnic and seating areas, new paths, a boardwalk and small viewing jetty across the pool and planting of native vegetation and trees. The view towards the Old Mill has been opened up, highlighted by an avenue of trees.

The City planted approximately 30,000 native seedlings and plants, and almost 90 trees in the area, with 20 existing trees retained on the site including two significant Eucalyptus trees. Forty-five different species of native plants were used with the majority grown in the City's nursery.

The award-winning Millers Pool landscape design was undertaken by Ecoscape in association with Stuart Pullyblank (Pullyblank Pty Ltd), with engineering design components by GFG group, lighting by ETC and main works by Civcon. ■

Hands up for Connect South



The City has been engaging with the community and stakeholders to help inform the place design concept plan for the Connect South project, stage one.

The Connect South team were set up on the corner of Mends Street and South Perth Esplanade on Saturday 22 July and 5 August 2017 and invited participants to paint their ideas and priorities on the Connect South car. A workshop with key stakeholders also provided valuable opportunity for people to contribute feedback. Ideas and concept

design elements were showcased at a community open day on Saturday 26 August 2017.

Design consultants, Place Laboratory, have developed the draft concept designs and report to present to Council at the October 2017 Council meeting. Once endorsed, the Connect South design concepts will go out for further consultation.

Connect South is a \$7.5 million major project, including a \$2.5 million grant

from the Federal Government's National Stronger Regions Fund, to enhance and invigorate the Mends Street precinct and foreshore area by creating a positive environment, both economically and socially.

Connect South includes Node 1: Mends Street as identified in the South Perth Foreshore Management Plan 2015. The vision for Node 1: Mends Street is to create:

- An active piazza and promenade
- An arrival place with day/night activities
- A gateway for the Mends Street precinct with connecting stories and interpretation of heritage, zoo and the river
- An integrated transport node utilising the river to connect with the Mends Street Precinct and surrounding area.

Ernest Johnson Reserve update

Stage one of the Ernest Johnson Reserve redevelopment continues and is on track for completion at the end of 2017.

This stage includes the construction of the main buildings which will house new clubrooms along with parking facilities and associated infrastructure.

The external cladding and brickwork on the two buildings is well under way and the feature walls are in progress for both buildings.

All brick and plaster work is expected to be completed in the next month along with the installation of solar panels and ceiling grids.

Stage two, which will include civil works such as the demolition of existing buildings, oval works and the construction of sporting facilities, playgrounds and social areas, will commence early in 2018.

The City's South Perth Station Precinct Reference Group has been formed. The group's members represent a diverse range of stakeholders with interests in the South Perth Station Precinct (SPSP) and immediate surrounding area.

The formation of the group follows an intensive period of investigations, research and community and stakeholder consultation undertaken this year during the City's South Perth Station Precinct: Place + Design study.

The group will provide the City and key stakeholders with an additional reference point for planning, development and place initiatives and activities in the SPSP and surrounding area.

Clontarf - Waterford - Salter Point Foreshore Masterplan



The Clontarf - Waterford - Salter Point (CWSP) Foreshore is an extensive area of natural reserves, estuarine conservation wetlands and public open space that occupy approximately 34 hectares of Canning River foreshore land.

The foreshore areas from Clontarf through to Waterford and Salter Point are known as the Canning River wetlands. These are the most extensive estuarine wetlands in the lower reaches of the Swan and Canning Rivers, providing the largest habitat area for many wildlife species.

In recognition of the CWSP Foreshore's ecological, cultural and recreational values, the City will develop a masterplan to provide a consolidated management strategy for this foreshore.

The masterplan will be the City's strategic guiding document for recreation, restoration and rehabilitation works on the CWSP Foreshore that address current and future management issues.

Consultation has commenced for stage one of the masterplanning process.

The City will engage the local community and key stakeholders to explore their vision on current foreshore management and short, medium and longer term landscaping possibilities to reflect user needs.

At the end of stage one, a concept will be developed as the foundation for the masterplan.

Draft Urban Forest Strategy

The City has developed a draft Urban Forest Strategy to identify opportunities to manage the challenges of urbanisation, development, climate change and population growth for our future generations.

A healthy urban forest is a vital community, environmental and economic asset. The Perth metropolitan area has doubled since the 1970s and this has resulted in the clearing of large areas of native vegetation. Over the last 30 years, canopy cover in the City has increased by 20 per cent on public property yet it has decreased by 20 per cent on private property.

The City is known for its tree-lined streets, green spaces, iconic foreshore and bushland reserves. Our urban forest is made up of nearly 400 hectares of trees and shrubs on public and private properties throughout the City.

The Strategy outlines the actions the City is taking to address these issues by actively working towards a goal of maintaining canopy cover into the future.

The document will be presented to Council in October 2017. ■



Hard Waste Collection



2 October - 20 November 2017

The City's annual hard waste collection is due to commence. Please assist us by placing hard rubbish on your own verge and into separate piles: metals, whitegoods, mattresses, e-waste and general waste.

Four cubic metres of waste will be collected from each residence. Waste left behind after the collection has finished is your responsibility and must be removed from the verge within seven days or \$200 - \$500 litter infringements will be issued.

Olives Reserve South upgrade



The City is proposing to upgrade the southern section of Olives Reserve in Como to complement the facilities already available at the northern end of the park.

A draft concept plan has been developed to create a more user friendly space for park visitors.

Features of the plan include dog agility exercise equipment, improved pathway connections from one end of the park to

the other, low level native species plantings to improve the visual appeal of the area and also to minimise freeway noise, tree planting to improve shade and provide screening whilst also maintaining the views of the river for neighbouring properties, drinking fountain and additional seating.

Community consultation has taken place on the concept plans and these are now being considered for incorporation into a final concept design. ■

A happy homecoming



Is your dog microchipped? Harvey (pictured) is and his microchip helped our rangers to deliver him home safely.

When he was found wandering in Kensington by one of the City's rangers, he was brought to our Animal Care Facility in Como. Believed to be lost, the ranger contacted Central Animal Records who were able to confirm Harvey's microchip details. Remarkably Harvey's home was in Dandaragan, roughly 180km north of Perth. He had been stolen three weeks prior.

The dog's owners were contacted by the City and reunited with their furry friend. The family were 'over the moon' to have Harvey back safe and sound. ■

Microchipping and registration

Did you know it is a legal requirement that all dogs are microchipped? A veterinarian, veterinarian nurse or a person with the relevant qualifications from a registered training provider can implant a microchip in your dog. Proof of microchipping is also required to register your dog. This can be provided with either a copy of the microchip certificate/paperwork or a Veterinary Surgeons Certificate. Owners of dogs that are not microchipped may be fined.

Reflecting on Manning's past

The opening of the Manning Community Centre and Library this year provides a timely opportunity to look back at the origins and development of the suburb.

The Manning area and Manning Road are not named after the family who operated a large dairy business at Hurlingham, but an entirely different family descended from Henry Lucius Manning, who began purchasing large tracts of land around Salter Point in 1840.

Manning did not live in the area, but his descendants gradually subdivided the land, forming part of Como in the early twentieth century. The Manning

area was first part of the Queen's Park local government division, before being transferred to Canning and finally to South Perth in 1955.

The end of the Second World War sparked a new era of urban design in Western Australia. The 'Garden City' concept, already used in the eastern states, attempted to provide both a liveable suburb and a ready-made community identity. The first attempt at a 'Garden City' suburb in South Perth was the Hurlingham Estate in 1945, and the curved layout and use of interwoven green space is still evident in the area

today. Construction of what was then known as Manning Park began in 1948, with thousands of new homes planned. War Service Homes provided at a discount to veterans, war widows and their families, were also widespread in Manning and many are still standing today.

The opening of the Sir Walter Murdoch Library's Manning Branch further entrenched the 'Garden City' feel of the area, as shopping centres, schools and government services were interspersed across the residential area, while heavily-curated parkland broke up the suburbia and provided seamless access to the nature and recreation facilities.

The new Manning Library and Community Centre is an extension of the 'Garden City' vision of post-war Manning. Situated between Manning Primary School and the nearby shopping precinct, it continues the design principles of a blended, integrated suburban landscape, and marks the latest phase in a long history of community involvement by the City of South Perth Library Service. ■

Housed within the Manning Community Centre, Manning Library opened in February this year. It has beautiful new spaces to read, study, research and relax as well as self-loan machines. Staff members are available to assist with the new system and answer any questions.

Between the two libraries we have more than 70,000 items across both locations. Our collection contains digital and traditional items including new and

popular titles across an extensive range of books, music CDs, DVDs, talking books and magazines.

We are dedicated to providing our community with free access to ideas and information to promote lifelong learning, nurture a love of literature, cultural expression and to spark the imagination and creativity of all.
