Major Projects

Moving into 2018, the City is continuing to consult and listen to our community while working to progress major projects including Connect South. This project has grown from the South Perth Foreshore Strategy and Management Plan which identified Mends

Street and the surrounding area as a key area to revitalise. Following engagement with our community and stakeholders in 2017, a Masterplan concept design was developed. The Masterplan will be presented to Council in February 2018 for consideration.

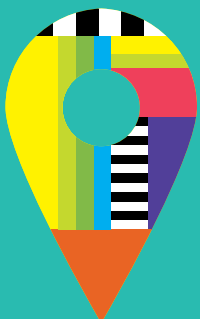

EJ Reserve upgrade – stage one now complete

The new Ernest Johnson Reserve (EJ) community facility buildings are now complete and local groups and sporting clubs will be moving in to their state of the art home throughout January and February this year.

The reserve and associated buildings are being redeveloped to better accommodate the needs of the local community. The development and implementation of a Masterplan for EJ Reserve was a key initiative in the City's Strategic Community Plan and Corporate Plan.

Stage two of the redevelopment, which will include demolition of the old buildings, works on the oval and construction of sports facilities, playgrounds and social areas, is scheduled to commence in early 2018 with completion planned for mid-year.

EJ Reserve provides recreational, sporting and social opportunities for the local community and users including:

CWSP Foreshore Masterplan update

The City is developing a masterplan for the Clontarf-Waterford-Salter Point (CWSP) Foreshore. The masterplan will consider the natural environment, recreational spaces and activities, and facilities and services of the Foreshore.

In November and December 2017, the City undertook community consultation inviting users, visitors and neighbouring residents of the Foreshore to provide feedback and share their ideas.

A draft concept plan and report is now being developed and will soon be presented to Council and released for further stakeholder and community feedback.

CONNECT SOUTH

The Connect South Masterplan Concept Design is a vision for the area which includes Mends Street (north and south), Mends Street foreshore, Windsor Park and Harper Terrace.

Following community consultation in November and December 2017, the Masterplan concept design will be presented to Council in February 2018 for consideration.

The focus for the first stage of the Connect South project includes the development of a Piazza on the Mends Street foreshore and minor upgrades to the north end of Mends Street. This stage is scheduled to be completed by December 2019.

South Perth Activity Centre Plan

The City is preparing an Activity Centre Plan for the South Perth Station Precinct and immediate surrounding area. The Plan will provide the strategic vision and statutory framework for the planning and development of the area, taking a holistic,

long-term approach that can be updated over time to respond to community and stakeholder needs and aspirations. The Plan will guide movement and access, land use and built form within the activity centre.

The preparation of the Plan is a key recommendation of the South Perth Peninsula Place and Design Report (May 2017) and is required under the state planning framework, which classifies the area as a District Centre.

Consultants RobertsDay were engaged in August 2017 to prepare the Activity Centre Plan and have now completed the required background analysis and begun preparation of the draft plan. Public consultation on the draft plan is anticipated to commence in April/May 2018, with a range of opportunities for the community and other stakeholders to be involved and provide feedback.

In 2017 the City established a Reference Group to provide the City and key stakeholders with an additional reference point for planning, development and place initiatives and activities in the South Perth Station Precinct (SPSP) and surrounding area. Additionally, the City and Zoo will continue discussions on transport initiatives and continue to raise awareness of the Zoo's Wildlife Conservation Action fundraising program.

RAC Intellibus™ trial

Have you taken a ride on the RAC Intellibus™ yet? The trial of Australia's first fully driverless and electric shuttle bus in South Perth has been extended for a further two years.

An additional \$980,000 will be invested in the project, a joint initiative of the RAC, State Government and City of South Perth. The funding is part of the Federal Government's Smart Cities and Suburbs Program.

The City is proud to partner with the RAC who are leading Australia's very first Automated Vehicle Trial. To date more than 10,100 people have booked a ride and many more have stopped to observe and take a photo. The RAC Intellibus® has completed more than 6,685 km in autonomous mode and completed more than 1,910 thirty minute rides ■

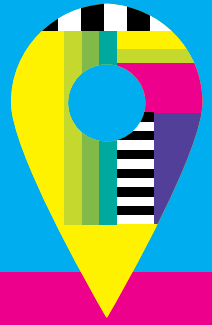

The Big Splash

A pod of 36 wildly colourful dolphin sculptures painted by local artists will swim into town as part of a public art exhibition to raise awareness and valuable funds for the Child and Adolescent Mental Health unit of Perth Children's Hospital. Funds raised will initiate innovative programs for children and adolescents with severe mental health disorders who are at significant risk.

PICTURE SOUTH PERTH

Take a trip down memory lane and explore the fascinating photographic archives of the City of South Perth.

Picture South Perth is an online collection of historic images from the City's Local History Collection. Dating back to the 1850s, the photographs showcase the people, places and events that have shaped the City.

The archive documents the rich tapestry of the City's history in an easily accessible format, allowing people to search, tag and comment on images to paint a more complete picture of the City's colourful and diverse history.

A collection of original artwork and postcard correspondence by children's author and illustrator May Gibbs and her father Herbert Gibbs is also featured on Picture South Perth. The Gibbs family were long-time residents of Suburban Rd, now known as Mill Point Rd, and many of the works in the collection were produced in South Perth ■

A VISIT TO THE OLD MILL

When was the last time you visited the Old Mill in South Perth? Built in 1835 and operating until 1859, the mill produced 680kg of flour per day at its peak. Since ceasing production, the mill has been used as a hotel, a residence, a wine saloon and a poultry farm.



In 1992, the Old Mill was granted to the City of South Perth to commemorate the centenary of the founding of Local Government in South Perth (1892). The stone buildings and site were repaired and upgraded and were then vested in the National Trust.

Take a guided tour

Guided tours of the Old Mill are available four days a week from Tuesday to Friday. The Old Mill caters to groups of up to 70 people. Bookings are recommended. Cost is free but a donation is appreciated.

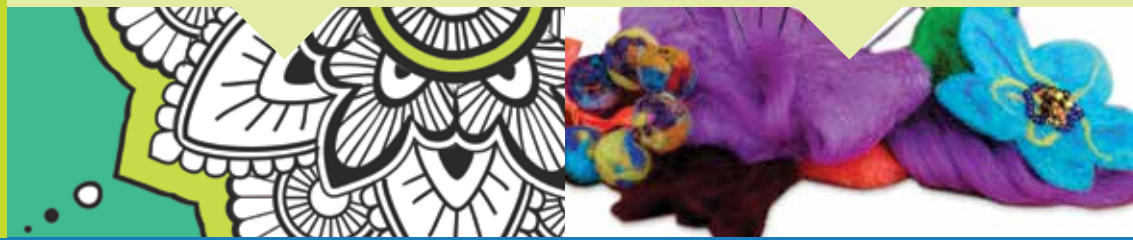

GOING COCONUTS FOR COIR POTS

The City's nursery has begun a trial, using 100 per cent biodegradable pots made from natural fibres as an innovative alternative solution to plastic pots.

Moulded from coconut husks, the coir fibre pots come in an array of shapes and sizes, and are used for a variety of planting purposes such as growing native tube stock used in revegetation projects.

The City has already potted thousands of the natural fibre pots in preparation for next winter's planting season. The City's nursery is one of the largest local government nurseries in metropolitan Perth supplying

stock for planting throughout the City and to the Town of Victoria Park.

The organic properties of coir fibre means that the pots and plants can be planted as one, the roots will grow through into the soil while the pot breaks down to become part of the organic structure of the soil. This takes away the risk of root damage when removing young plants from the pots.

Coir fibre pots have the potential to become a viable alternative to plastic forestry tubes and become a standard pot of choice for projects across WA ■
