## MESSAGE FROM YOUR COUNCIL



Here comes autumn, the point of the year when the long hot summer is behind us and we start to dream of cooler weather.

This month the City launches a brand new community festival called Hello Manning. The celebration will run across the weekend of Saturday 30 and Sunday 31 March at Manning Community Centre and James Miller Oval. I am looking forward to the live music and entertainment on offer, as well as catching up with local people, community groups and businesses who will be taking part.

At the area adjacent to the Mends Street jetty, construction of the City's \$7.5 million Connect South project has started. This exciting revitalisation project will transform the Mends Street precinct, creating an urban heart for South Perth and a destination for our community and visitors. Development of a new pedestrian-friendly piazza on the Mends Street foreshore complete with public artworks that reflect the City's relationship with Perth Zoo, as well as seating and stunning lighting will form an eye-catching entry point to Mends Street, Perth Zoo and greater South Perth.

As our City's population continues to grow, like many other local governments, we are faced with the challenge of balancing the needs and aspirations of our community and meeting State Government infill targets. Our City has a fundamental role to play in accommodating growth and in recognition of this, we are preparing strategic planning documents to direct the City on this journey including the Local Planning Strategy (LPS) and South Perth Activity Centre Plan.

I encourage all members of our community to help the City shape its inaugural LPS and check out what is proposed, and let us know your thoughts. The draft LPS has been endorsed by the Council and the Western Australian Planning Commission for public advertising and is now open for public comment. There are a number of ways you can be involved and share your feedback with us, simply visit yoursay.southperth.wa.gov.au for details. This important strategic document will guide the City, setting a framework for local planning and development over the next 10 to 15 years.

From November last year to February this year, the Council took part in a series of workshops with town planning, urban design and placemaking consultants RobertsDay, as well as architects and demographers, to refine the draft South Perth Activity Centre Plan (ACP). These valuable sessions provided all elected members with the opportunity to further investigate a range of relevant matters including population and demographic forecasts; building height limits; distribution of building height; street setbacks and design quality requirements. 

### **NEW LEASE OF LIFE FOR OLD MILL**

The Old Mill has stood proudly on the South Perth peninsula since 1835, but this year the historic building is receiving some much needed care and attention. Building works will be conducted under the supervision of qualified heritage architects, and should assist the Old Mill to remain as a fascinating relic and cultural symbol of City of South Perth for years to come.

# SMOKING CEREMONY MARKS THE START OF CONNECT SOUTH

After years of planning and development, the City's Connect South project has entered the construction phase with the major project set to transform Mends Street to become the gateway to South Perth and a destination for the local community and visitors alike.

A Noongar smoking ceremony was held on the project site on South Perth Foreshore in early February to recognise the Noongar/Bibbulmun people and their significant contribution to the City of South Perth and mark the start of construction. Performed by Matthew McGuire and his brother Walter, the ceremony was attended by City of South Perth CEO Geoff Glass, members of the City's Aboriginal Reference Group and the Connect South project team.

The first stage of Connect South will create a vibrant and accessible civic space, and an attractive entry point to Mends Street, the Perth Zoo and greater South Perth. Works will include the development of a piazza on the Mends Street foreshore and upgrades to the northern area of Mends Street, between Mill Point Road and South Perth Esplanade.

Construction is anticipated to be completed in November 2019 at an estimated total project cost of \$7.5 million with \$2.5 million from Federal Government National Stronger Regions funding and \$5 million from the City of South Perth.

## **PARKING AND ROAD ACCESS**

During the construction phase of Connect South temporary changes to parking and road access will be in place. Fortnightly updates are available to view on the Connect South project page of our website. The City understands that these works may be disruptive and we thank our community and all stakeholders for their understanding and cooperation during this important revitalisation project.

## A SUSTAINABLE SOLUTION FOR NEIL MCDOUGALL LAKE

The City has embarked on a project to provide a long-term, sustainable solution to manage *Lemna minor*, a non-harmful aquatic plant species commonly known as duckweed, in Neil McDougall Lake in Como.

The lake is a receiving body of water for stormwater, and picks up nutrients from the surrounding catchment area which are then deposited into the lake. The duckweed feeds off this nutrient and coupled with warm weather, it flourishes.

The City has developed a preliminary Water Sensitive Urban Design to help to reduce the level of nutrients before they enter the lake.

## CITY PROJECTS

## SUPPORT FOR RECREATION AND AQUATIC FACILITY

The City is investigating the feasibility and funding opportunities for a recreation and aquatic facility (RAF) for the City of South Perth and surrounding area.

One of the key strategies within the City's Strategic Community Plan 2017-2027 is to: plan for and promote the development of recreation and aquatic facilities to service community needs.

The current lack of indoor sporting facilities in the City, along with the need to determine the ongoing viability and long term use of George Burnett Leisure Centre (GBLC), Collier Park Golf Course and Richardson Reserve, and the strong community desire for an aquatic centre has led the City to initiate the RAF feasibility project.

For the project to progress, funding partners need to be secured to ensure that the RAF will be a financially sustainable consideration both now and into the future. Federal financial support will be sought in the lead up to the upcoming Federal Government elections and a number of additional partnership opportunities will be investigated.

Initial discussions with state sporting bodies and local schools and clubs have been positive with stakeholders indicating their support for the proposed facility.

Conventional swimming pools require substantial ongoing financial subsidy to meet operational costs. The City is therefore investigating the potential for a centre that would include aquatics with a number of sporting and recreation facilities in a single integrated venue to benefit from economies of scale in services provision, capital cost and ongoing operational costs.





### SITE SELECTION

A number of potential site locations have been identified with a key driver being proximity to Curtin University to take advantage of the partnership opportunities with students, associated education programs and the long term growth of area.

In reviewing potential locations, existing City assets which could accommodate or integrate with the RAF were considered. Twenty-three possible sites were identified and six were shortlisted.

## **Shortlisted sites:**

- Collier Reserve
- The City of South Perth Recycling Centre
- The City of South Perth Recycling and Operations Centre
- Collier Park Golf Course (north of the existing club house)
- Collier Park Golf Course South East Corner
- George Burnett Leisure Centre.

Each site is being evaluated and will be assessed based on factors including, but not limited to; available space, funding partnership opportunities, traffic management, accessibility to main roads, public transport and bike lanes/paths.

A feasibility/business case is being developed and is anticipated to be presented to Council at its July 2019 meeting.



## WEATHER PROTECTION FOR EJ RESERVE FACILITIES

## CANNING BRIDGE ACTIVITY CENTRE PLAN REVIEW

Since 2016, the Canning Bridge Activity Centre Plan (CBACP) has been guiding development in the 800 metres radius surrounding the Canning Bridge train station, on both sides of the Canning River.

The City developed the CBACP in conjunction with the City of Melville to support development in the precinct with a mix of office, retail, residential, recreational and cultural uses, maximising opportunities offered by its unique transport hub location.

At the August 2018 Council Meeting, the City of South Perth Council resolved to commence a review of the CBACP to identify opportunities for refining the use and interpretation of the plan.

The City is now facilitating a community-wide conversation and invite you to share your thoughts and feedback to assist the City in reviewing the plan.

As part of this project the City will establish a Citizen Stakeholder Group (CSG) comprised of stakeholders from the CBACP community. The CSG will provide advice to Council on recommended amendments to the CBACP, based on community and stakeholder feedback.

## DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION RECEIVED FOR CIVIC SITE

The City received a Development Application for the Civic Site from Finbar Group Limited in December 2018. The site is a triangular-shaped parcel of land bounded by Labouchere Road, Mends Street and Mill Point Road in South Perth. The 8,206m² site is the focal and structural centre for the South Perth peninsula and presents a unique development opportunity.

The application proposes a 39 storey north tower and a 22 storey south tower (including enclosed roof top services and podium levels) with 309 apartments, 25 ground-floor commercial tenancies and one commercial tenancy on level three.

Following the City's assessment of the application, the City will prepare a Responsible Authority Report (RAR) and provide a recommendation with the final decision to be made by the Metro Central Joint Development Assessment Panel (JDAP).

As part of the City's development assessment process, the proposal will be referred to the City's Design Review Panel (DRP) for comment on the overall design quality.

It is expected that the Civic Site application will be determined at a JDAP meeting to be held in March 2019 however if further information and/or amended plans are required the meeting may be deferred.

The City invited the community and other stakeholders to comment on the application between 29 January and 25 February 2019. Feedback received was taken into consideration in the development of the City's formal recommendations to be presented to the Metro Central JDAP.

## STRATEGIC PLANNING

## OUR DRAFT LOCAL PLANNING STRATEGY

Perth's population is growing and the City of South Perth is updating its planning framework to accommodate this growth.

By 2031 our City is forecast to grow by approximately 10,200 people and is expected to accommodate 4,700 new dwellings. To prepare for this growth, the City has prepared a draft Local Planning Strategy (LPS) to guide development over the next 10-15 years.

The draft LPS includes:


- A plan for where and how new housing will be accommodated. The draft LPS
  recommends concentrating growth to key nodes, known as 'activity centres', and
  along roads with good transport connectivity, known as 'urban corridors' where
  access to services, employment and transport is greatest
- Direction for managing the City's transport network including growing our cycling network and supporting expanded public transport services
- Investigation of models for delivering new civic infrastructure, such as enhanced parklands, community spaces and upgraded streetscapes
- A plan for conserving the City's social and environmental values, including heritage places, urban tree canopy, and improving the design of new buildings.

In total, the draft LPS proposes over fifty actions to help shape the future planning of the City.

### **HAVE YOUR SAY**

Public consultation on the draft LPS will commence on 12 March. There will be a number of opportunities to learn about the strategy, provide feedback and help to shape the LPS.

# COUNCIL TO CONSIDER DRAFT SOUTH PERTH ACTIVITY CENTRE PLAN

The City is developing a South Perth Activity Centre Plan to set out the long term strategic vision and the statutory planning requirements for development within the area that stretches from the tip of South Perth Peninsula to Richardson Park and the Perth Zoo.

At the October 2018 Council Meeting, elected members resolved to further consider the draft South Perth Activity Centre Plan (ACP) and associated scheme amendment before both documents were finalised for public advertising.

In February 2019, the Council completed a series of intensive workshops to assist in refining the draft ACP and scheme amendment. Items considered at the workshops included: population and demographic forecasts; building height limits; distribution of building height; street setbacks; interface with Perth Zoo; design quality requirements and public realm improvements. The workshops were facilitated by town planning, urban design and placemaking experts RobertsDay, with assistance from architects WITH Architecture Studio and demographers .id The Population Experts.

The City has modified the draft ACP and scheme amendment in accordance with the outcomes of the workshops, for reconsideration by the Council at a Special Council Meeting to be held on 6 March 2019. Once endorsed by Council for public advertising, both documents will be presented to the community and other stakeholders for comment. Following consultation, the City will further review the draft ACP and scheme amendment before they are presented to Council for final endorsement and submitted to the Western Australian Planning Commission for approval.

## The City will collect a maximum of three cubic metres per premise consisting of:

- Uncontaminated green/garden waste
- Tree prunings/branches with a maximum diameter of 150mm and maximum length of 1.5m. All material for collection should be neatly placed on the verge with cut ends toward the street.

## The City will not collect:

- Lawn clippings and leaves, these may be placed in our free Green Waste recycling bags available from the City's Recycling Centre
- General waste, building or household waste
- Tree trunks and stumps larger than 150mm in diameter or 1.5m in length
- Dug out lawn
- Green waste that is contaminated by household rubbish.

If your green waste doesn't comply, it will not be collected.

## NEW DEFIBRILLATORS UP SURVIVAL ODDS

Working in collaboration with St John WA, the City of South Perth has installed 10 new defibrillators at City facilities, including four 24-hour accessible units that can be operated by anyone with the machine's voice commands providing clear instructions to the user.

The devices were facilitated via St John WA's First Responder program, a service that aims to get defibrillators to cardiac arrest victims in the vital minutes before an ambulance arrives.

Defibrillators located at Manning Community Centre, Collier Park Golf Course, Collins Street Centre and the John McGrath Pavilion at Ernest Johnson Reserve are mounted to the exterior of the buildings.

They are accessible to the community 24/7, by PIN code that is provided by calling "000" when needed.

Defibrillators are now installed at the following facilities: Collier Park Village, Collier Park Golf Course, Collins Street Centre, George Burnett Leisure Centre, John McGrath Pavilion, Manning Library, Manning Senior Citizens, Operations Centre, South Perth Civic Centre, South Perth Community Hall, South Perth Library, South Perth Senior Citizens, Waste Services and Animal Care Facility.

Each defibrillator appears on the St John Ambulance First Responder App available to download from Apple's App Store and Google Play.

#### Stormwater pit installation

Installation of stormwater pits in sections of Monash Avenue, Bessell Avenue, Todd Avenue in Como and Dyson Street in South Perth to capture excess stormwater flows has commenced. Works are scheduled to be completed in early March 2019.

#### **Connect South - Mends Street Foreshore**

Construction of the Connect South project has commenced in the Mends Street precinct in South Perth. Works include the development of a piazza on the Mends Street foreshore and minor upgrades to the northern area of Mends Street, between Mill Point Road and South Perth Esplanade. Works are anticipated to be completed by November 2019. For updates visit, southperth.wa.gov.au/connectsouth.

### **Olives Reserve**

Works at the southern portion of Olives Reserve in Como will include the installation of dog-exercise equipment, footpaths, irrigation upgrades, hydro-zoning, shrub and tree planting and turf upgrades. The northern portion of the reserve will undergo upgrades to existing garden beds with mulch, planting and irrigation upgrades. Works are anticipated to start in late April/ early May 2019.

### **Building maintenance**

Three weather protection awnings extensions will be installed on the western side of the John McGrath Pavilion and Hall at Ernest Johnson Reserve, South Perth. Works are scheduled to be completed by the end of May 2019.

Works have started at McDougall Park Community Kindergarten in Como and are scheduled to be completed in April 2019. Works include construction of a new undercover recreational space, upgrades to the air-conditioning and the inclusion of a universal access toilet.

The roofs of the Old Mill and Cottage in South Perth will be replaced with Sheoak timber shingles and batons, and open drainage channels to reduce water ingress will be installed. Works dates are yet to be confirmed.

#### **Road rehabilitation**

Works to be undertaken in March and April will include some or all of the following: road resurfacing, replacement of street kerbing on same alignment, replacement/installation of stormwater drainage structures and replacement signage and road markings. Works will take place at the following locations:

- Manning Rd (west bound) Kent St to Gillon St, Waterford
- Duckett Dr/Cloister Ave intersection, Manning
- Norton St Sandgate St to Canning Hwy, Como.
