Special Electors' Meeting - Minutes

Minutes of the Special Electors' Meeting held in the Community Hall, Sandgate Street, South Perth Wednesday 6 May 2015 at 6:00 pm.

I. DECLARATION OF OPENING

I.I Welcome introduction and outlining of meeting procedures

The Presiding Member opened the meeting at 6.06pm and welcomed everyone in attendance. She then acknowledged we are meeting on the lands of the Noongar / Bibbulmun people and that we honour them as the traditional custodians of this land and acknowledge their deep feelings of attachment to country.

I.2 Mayor's Statement

The Presiding Member advised that the City's Standing Orders Local Law will apply to the running of the meeting and outlined the following points in relation to proceedings:

- Mobile phones are to be turned off or on to silent.
- The meeting will commence with a presentation from the City of South Perth followed by a presentation from the representatives of the petitioners.
- Only Electors can speak or vote at the meeting. Any Councillor wishing to speak does so as an Elector.
- Councillors are not obliged to attend Special Electors' Meetings but have chosen to do so to listen to the comments made by the residents of South Perth. Councillors will not respond to any questions.
- Council is not bound by any decision made at the meeting. Motions passed will be considered by Council at a Special Council Meeting scheduled for Wednesday 20 May 2015 at 6.00pm in the Council Chamber.
- Electors will be invited to make comment and ask questions. Each speaker must state their name and address and restrict their comments to the subject of the meeting and will be allowed no more than 5 minutes.
- Speakers should not repeat comments / points already raised by another speaker. There will be the opportunity to voice support in the vote when any Motion is put.
- Meeting protocol will be adhered to.

2.2 Electors

There were approximately 200 members of the public present.

3. **PETITION**

The Presiding Member stated that the meeting had been called in response to a petition received on 15 April 2015 together with approximately 292 signatures. She then read aloud the text of the petition as follows:

"To: The Mayor of South Perth, the undersigned say:

We are concerned about the proposed development at 74 Mill Point Road on the Mill Point Peninsula and similar future development in the Mill Point Peninsula.

We believe that the Mill Point Peninsula is an area of natural beauty and heritage which should be preserved for all Western Australians.

We believe that in the interests of fairness, clarity and democracy there should be greater public consultation and feedback about planning discretions currently being exercised under City of South Perth Local Planning Scheme (Amendment 25) which impact directly or indirectly upon the Mill Point Peninsula.

Now petition the City of South Perth as follows:

- 1. We request you to call a Special Electors' Meeting to discuss development issues concerning the Mill Point Peninsula, to be advertised widely;
- 2. We request that the Council resolve immediately to exclude the Mill Point Peninsula from the South Perth Station Precinct;
- 3. We request that further action in connection with Amendment 46 be deferred (i) pending the removal of the Mill Point Peninsula from the Station Precinct and (ii) pending a review of the need for a new Local Planning Strategy.

Our petition is important because:

- 1. There are compelling and urgent reasons for excluding the Mill Point Peninsula from the South Perth Station Precinct.
- 2. There has been inadequate public consultation concerning the potential impact upon the Mill Point Peninsula of high rise developments in the South Perth Station.
- 3. Irrevocable decisions are being taken which will have far reaching consequences for South Perth and the Mill Point Peninsula in particular;
- 4. It will benefit the wider community;
- 5. Democracy, fairness and common sense requires it.

The South Perth Council should resolve to initiate immediately a Local Planning Strategy for the Mill Point Peninsula and the land included in the South Perth Precinct Plan pursuant to the requirement in Paragraph 5.5 in the Precinct Action Plan.

The South Perth Council should inform JDAP that applications for developments of heights of more than 25 metres in the Mill Point Peninsula (including the 74 Mill Point Road development application) should be refused as premature until such time as a Local Planning Strategy is in place which addresses the Mill Point Peninsula.

By reason of the State Architect's report into the proposed development at 74 Mill Point Road, this house has no confidence in the ability of the planners in the South Perth Council to determine whether a development application meets the Performance Criteria in Schedule 9 of the TPS, thereby underscoring the urgent need for a Local Planning Strategy.
