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## 1. NEW BUSINESS OF AN URGENT NATURE INTRODUCED BY DECISION OF MEETING

In accordance with Clause 5.4 of the City of South Perth Standing Orders Local Law 2007:

- (1) In cases of extreme urgency or other special circumstances, matters may, on a motion by the Presiding Member that is carried by the meeting, be raised without notice and decided by the meeting.
- (2) In subclause (1), 'cases of extreme urgency or other special circumstances' means matters that have arisen after the preparation of the agenda that are considered by the Presiding Member to be of such importance and urgency that they are unable to be dealt with administratively by the City and must be considered and dealt with by the Council before the next meeting.

#### 14.1 Extraordinary Election - Como Ward

#### **Summary**

This report is to declare that the Electoral Commission will conduct the Extraordinary Election to fill the vacancy in the Como Ward created by Councillor Carl Celedin resigning, and for an Extraordinary Election to be conducted by a postal method.

#### Officer Recommendation


#### That Council:

- 1. Declare, in accordance with section 4.20(4) of the *Local Government Act* 1995, the Electoral Commissioner to be responsible for the conduct of the extraordinary election for the Como Ward.
- 2. Decide, in accordance with section 4.61(2) of the *Local Government Act* 1995, that the method of conducting the extraordinary election will be as a postal election for the Como Ward.
- 3. Allocates an amount of \$30,000 in the 2022/23 budget to cover the costs of the extraordinary election.

**Absolute Majority Required** 

#### **Background**

Councillor Carl Celedin was elected to the City of South Perth Council in October 2019 for a four-year term, expiring in October 2023. On 9 December 2022, Councillor Celedin submitted his resignation to the CEO and Mayor effective from 12 December 2022.



#### 10.4.1 Extraordinary Election - Como Ward

In accordance with section 4.17 of the *Local Government Act 1995*, a vacant Councillor office can remain unfilled until the next ordinary election if the vacancy occurred after the third Saturday in January of the election year, and before the third Saturday in July of that election year. As Councillor Celedin resigned before the third Saturday in January 2023, the City must hold an extraordinary election.

Cr Celedin's resignation creates a vacancy in the Como Ward. Local government elections must be conducted in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1995* and associated regulations. Section 4.9(1)(b) of the *Local Government Act 1995* requires Council to determine how it wishes to deal with the vacancy within one month of the date the vacancy was created.

In accordance with Section 4.20(1) of the *Local Government Act 1995*, the Chief Executive Officer is the returning officer for local government elections, unless and in accordance with Section 4.20(2), another person is appointed by the Council as being responsible for the election. Any other person, other than the Chief Executive Officer, is required to be approved by the Western Australian Electoral Commissioner.

The Council can decide, under Section 4.20(4) of the *Local Government Act 1995*, for the Western Australian Electoral Commissioner to be responsible for an election, which includes the appointment of a returning officer and other arrangements associated with that election. The City recently received an in principle agreement from the Western Australian Electoral Commissioner to conduct the City of South Perth Extraordinary Election for the Como Ward. In accordance with the *Local Government Act 1995*, Council is requested to confirm the Electoral Commissioner as being responsible for conducting the City of South Perth Extraordinary Election and to endorse a postal voting method be undertaken for that election.

There are two methods for conducting local government elections, this being postal voting or voting in person. The *Local Government Act 1995* stipulates that postal elections must only be conducted by the Western Australian Electoral Commission.

There are significant benefits for the elections to be conducted as a postal election:-

- It increases the voter turnout;
- Having an external person appointed by the Electoral Commission as the returning officer creates separation and provides independence to the process;
- It is easier for electors to vote.

#### Comment

The Electoral Commission have advised that they can conduct an extraordinary election for the Como Ward on Friday 3 March 2023 with nominations opening on Wednesday 18 January 2023 and closing on Wednesday 25 January 2023.

#### Consultation

Advice has been received from the Electoral Commissioner that they are willing to conduct the postal election for the City of South Perth Extraordinary Election for the Como Ward.

#### 10.4.1 Extraordinary Election - Como Ward

#### **Financial Implications**

It is estimated that the cost for the Western Australian Electoral Commission to conduct the 2023 City of South Perth Extraordinary Election for the Como Ward would be approximately \$30,000 (including GST).

Costs not incorporated in this estimate include any non-statutory advertising (such as additional advertisements in community newspapers), any legal expenses (other than those that are determined to be borne by the Western Australian Electoral Commission in a Court of Disputed Returns), and employee costs to work in the polling place on Election Day.

The City's current budget does not include any provision for an extraordinary election.
