1. What was your favourite book as a child?

The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe by C.S. Lewis. I loved Aslan and wanted to be like Susan but most importantly, it made me want to write stories of my own.

2. What is your favourite place to read?

It is the big, red couch in the quiet of early morning or in bed at night before I go to sleep.

3. What makes a great book great?

A great book will be like a great friend. It will comfort you and challenge you. You'll feel like someone understands you and perhaps learn to better understand someone else's point of view.

1. What was your favourite book as a child?

My favourite book was the first Calvin and Hobbes collection, that was originally a gift to my Mum when I was born. It felt like looking through a strange mirror, at another version of my life, with a child my age, their fears, imagination, frustrations, hopes and dreams.

2. What is your favourite place to read?

Wherever I am! Every place is a good place to read. On the sofa, in the garden, by the river, on a bus. The magic of reading is that it instantly transports you into a different space, a different place, a different persons experience.

I wouldn't read in a bath though... I don't think books and water are a good combination.

3. What makes a great book great?

A great book isn't just about the book itself. Books by themselves are lifeless. A book becomes great when it meets the right person at the right time. The spark that occurs when these three aspects line up can be life changing.

5. What do you say to people who don't like reading?

There are all kinds of different types of reading, and different things to read. It would be a shame to stop reading just because you read a couple of boring books. The right book is waiting for you somewhere, waiting to meet you, waiting to light that spark within you.
